Student use of technology shall be increasingly evident in classrooms as evidenced by formal and informal observation.	3rd-5th grade students are getting plenty of screen time this week and next. We just finished the CAT version of the ELA test and will move on to the Performance Task. The week of May 14th we will test in math and science (5th grade only). We are trying to gather input from teachers on how to best utilize our computer lab tech with the position being cut to 3.5 hours next year. Only grades K-2 will be visiting the lab on a weekly basis. Teachers of students in grades 3-5 will be invited to visit on their time should they need to use it.
Research and plan for expansion of AVID across all grade levels.	The admin team met with Michel Kelly via conference call at our May admin meeting. Our goal was to align our PD sessions for August and possibly November. It sounds as though our August PD day will be focused on incorporating WICOR into each classroom.

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LCAP GOAL 3: Ensure all student populations achieve annual measurable academic growth by providing targeted additional support in literacy and math.


