T - We need to figure a new protocol for picking up students at dismissal out in front of the building. I have watched from the window, the busses almost hit the building out back during the safety evacuation. We have had busses that have left before the 5th to 8th graders were called down to get on the bus – the white top bus – the mini bus.

A - that bus had a volatile student and when they need to go I sent them on their way – not to wait too long – I gave them the all clear.

T - we need to address what we are doing in the pre-school - \$5,000 month min for bus monitors. The midday busses, too – I am not sure how we sustain it – we did not budget for the extra cost. We might ask for tuition.

M – We have to have like numbers SPED – Typical Peers

T – I don't have the answers, I am just presenting the issues

M – Both the midday busses – do they have SPED students on it?

T – Doesn't matter – monitors are required for all pre-K kids - \$125/day per bus (\$25) – all our busses pick up pre-K students.

L – Can we limit it to 2 busses (morning, midday, night) three times a day? Pre-K would not use big bus.

Ly – IEP specific rules don't allow it.

M – We tried to eliminate a big bus and add in a pre-k bus for only one monitor?

T – no savings on the size of the bus. It means combining busses – which they can do but it means kids on a bus at 6:30 - 6:45.

A – Can we have an understanding that if we send a bus to your house and no one get on – we eliminate the stop. Bus A is the only full one when we get here. The short bus only has 3 kids on it for the same price.

T - the tiny bus is the feeder and goes where the big busses can't go. No one gets on it in the afternoon.

A – When ACCESS is not in session – they use it. They don't come every day. If the bus driver knows ahead of time that the kids are going to ACCESS, the bus will not come.

T – We are paying for a contracted service – and if they are not coming – we are still paying for it.

A – I believe it is better for the busses to be in the back. We have dismissal down to 4 minutes. It is organized – walking out the building and right on the bus. Busses are waiting to get the message to go. There is a little drama between the busses in the morning – they need to turn their lights off and wait to let the kids off. Our bus dismissal is seamless.

Ly – Are we responsible for any damage?

T – The bus company has asked – not to back up. It is a tight corner – Ed has asked.

A – Every bus has to back up every single day – to turn around.

M – When we had the bus evacuation, it was the first couple of weeks of school – we had new people – we tried different methods and reflected on what works – we did not have a system down. I completely agree – I am against putting the busses in the front – 400 kids coming in two doors. We have dismissal down solid now. Little kids first and then bigger kids – safety wise – I think we would be going backwards if we go out front. If the two male bus drivers would stop – we have 200 kids waiting for 3 kids to get off. If the bus company could get that under control.

L - I think we go back to the bus company and tell them we do not think the front is safe for stated reasons and we go one bus for pre-k we will save money.

A – I have also offered to ride the bus anytime. I know the monitors are there for pre-k – but they sometimes ask me - we have a pretty good relationship with the drivers.

MH – We could look at widening the road in the back.

M – Kids get dropped off at 7:00 – if they are running through the busses – it is scary.

T – We cannot maintain paying for all the monitors – but consolidating routes has problems, too.

M - A and I can go over the bus list in the summer and call the families to get the stops off the route. This could eliminate headaches for the drivers.

T - I asked the bus company for this data – they are stopping because that one day – a kid will be waiting – they need to be called to get the stop off the list.

L-If they take the bus in the morning then go to ACCESS – or parents drop off in the morning and then bus at night.

M - or sports after school. The first step would be to eliminate the stops.

T - 20 seats on the midday for pre-k.

L – Eliminating buses and combining routes could be a possibility.
