Greetings,

One of the recommendations from our Facilities Task Force was for our school district to create a school finance committee. The Finance Committee must recognize it is critical to be good stewards of public funds by ensuring transparency, accountability, and efficiency in the

district's finances. The finance committee will be designed to assist the school board in fulfilling its fiscal oversight responsibilities and ensuring the public's trust. The school board may ask the finance committee to review any matters potentially having a significant impact on the district finances before the board takes action.

#### FINANCE COMMITTEE ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Assist the District in educating the general public concerning school finance issues, including creating reader-friendly budget information
- Review the District's annual audit and accompanying management letters and submit any comments or recommendations to the Board.
- 3. Review the annual budget, revenue and expenditure forecasts, and submit any recommendations to the Board.
- 4. Review and make recommendations regarding long-term capital plans and financial strategies for major projects for the district.
- 5. Recommend transfers between funds for special projects.
- 6. Advise the Board of any local, state, and/or federal policies, legislation or developing trends which may impact district financial goals and priorities.
- 7. Provide input on other issues identified by the Board.

Any parent or patron that resides in the Tri-Valley School District is eligible to be a member of the finance committee. # HIGH SCHOOL - MR. BRAD MCDONAND



Greetings from the high school! We are rapidly approaching parent-teacher conferences, scheduled for Thursday, October 14th, from 2:30 p.m. – 8:30 p.m. Parent-teacher conferences are an important opportunity for families to meet with teachers to discuss their child's progress and ways to help them improve. This year we are offering a hybrid approach of online and in-person conferences to better meet the schedules and needs of our families. Below is the schedule we will be following:

- Virtual conferences will be held from 2:30 p.m. to 4:45 p.m. for parents/students that prefer an online format.
- $\bullet$  In-person conferences will be held in the high school gym from 5:30 p.m. 8:30 p.m. Parents who choose the in-person format will follow the traditional face-to-face

approach with their child's teachers.

We look forward to meeting with you to discuss your child's progress up to this point in the school year. Additional information regarding conference sign-up was emailed to all parents and students. Please let me know if you have any questions regarding the upcoming parent-teacher conferences.

As the school year continues, I would like to remind parents that attendance is critical to your child's success. There is a documented link between attendance and declining achievement. School attendance and student achievement go hand-in-hand. The research is clear regarding attendance: Students who attend school regularly are able to learn more, have fewer discipline problems, develop better study habits, and often are more successful than students who do not. Children who do not attend school regularly rarely achieve their full potential. Missed instruction and the challenges students face as they attempt to complete missed work are important factors that impact student performance. While regular attendance is not a problem for most of our students, I would encourage parents to monitor and limit absences to enhance their child's academic success.

Similar to regular attendance, timely completion of homework can impact achievement. Homework is an important extension of learning in the classroom. We have established homework guidelines to reinforce the lessons taught in the classroom and to help develop positive study habits. Parents play an important role in making homework a positive experience for their children. Please read and discuss the homework guidelines with your child. Parents and teachers working together will ensure that all students have an opportunity to achieve success in the classroom!

Please do not hesitate to reach out to me if you have any questions, concerns, or ideas you would like to discuss.

# INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL - MR. ERIC SMART



Greetings from Tri-Valley Intermediate School! It's been a great start to the year with our new schedule in place, and I am so thankful for the staff and students for their flexibility in taking on something new. I am also thankful for the school bond passing, which will give the Intermediate School much needed space in the near future. With the additional space, we will be able to alleviate a couple times in the day where we are currently cramped in the schedule.

This year is the first year of our Intermediate School. If you have a student in grades 5-8 you have probably seen that term in one way or another on school communication. In an effort to combine our 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> grades (former

elementary) with 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> (former junior high) we are working to combine ourselves into a distinct, unified part of the Tri-Valley School District. One way we are working to achieve this goal is combining the 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> grade and 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grade student councils. The 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grade have chosen their representation and now the 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> grades will do the same. From there, we will start having student meetings as a larger group. I am hopeful this is one small way to achieve our goal.

In the next few weeks, staff will be breaking down testing data in order to better plan and deliver instruction. Our staff will be working to not only meet students where they are currently at, but also push them to attain the standards set by the state and then tested on in the spring. The test is commonly referred to as the Smarter Balanced Assessments. If you feel instruction is changing course in the next few weeks, this is most likely the reason as we dig deeper into our data in order to best serve our students' needs.

Parent/Teacher Conferences are on Thursday, October 14<sup>th</sup> from 2:30 p.m.-8:30 p.m. Additional information regarding the format of conferences was sent to parents on Friday, October 1<sup>st</sup> and can be found on the school website. I would ask you to please make plans to attend conferences and if that is not possible to reach out to your child's teachers.


