Failure to state the delivery time in the bid obligates the bidder to complete delivery by the school's requested date. All deliveries must be made during normal work hours. The vendor shall give the school immediate notice of any anticipated delays or shutdowns that will affect the delivery requirement. Lost or damage that occurs during shipping, prior to the order being received by the school, is the vendor's responsibility. All orders should be properly packaged to prevent damage during shipping.
