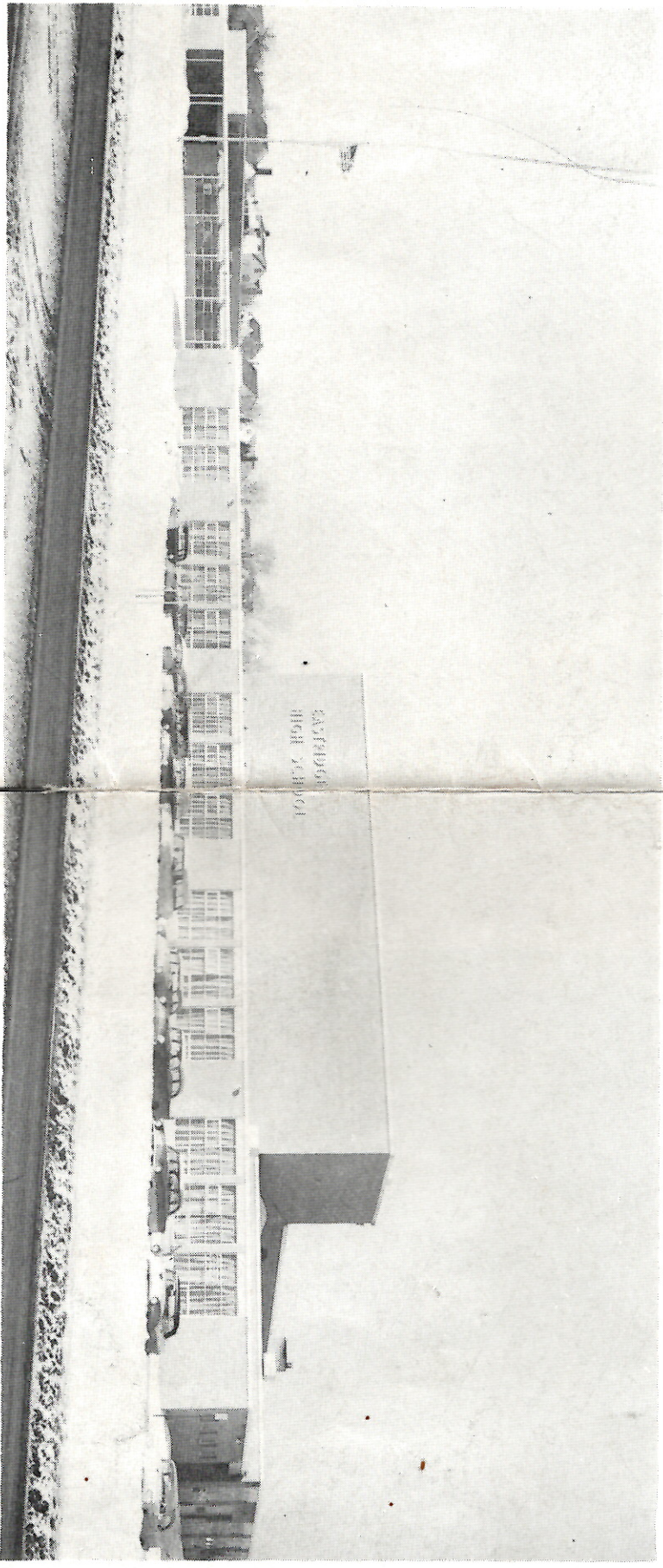

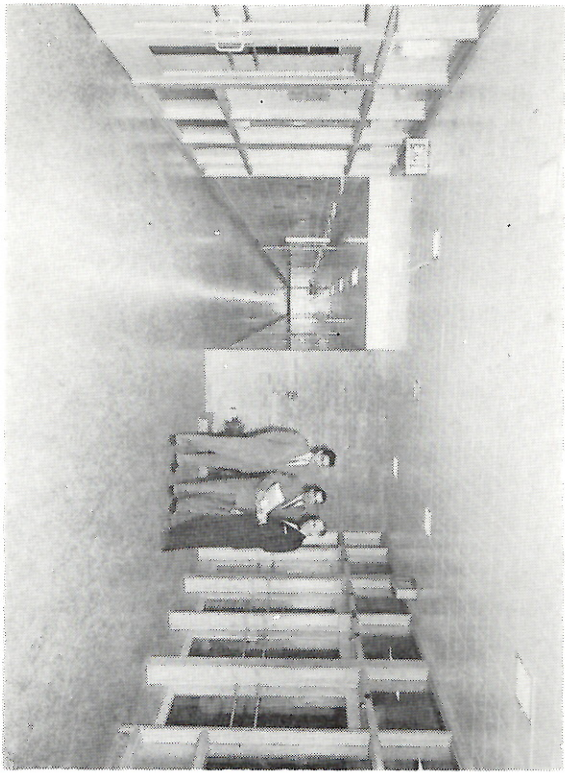

TEACHERS' WORKROOM

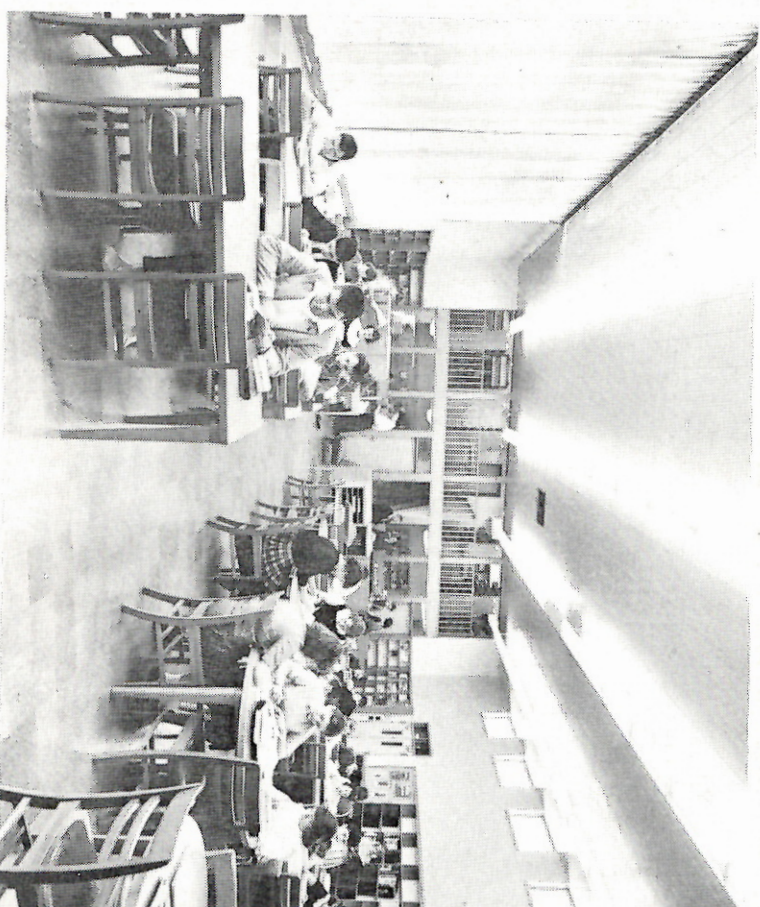
Three small workrooms are provided for teachers with time saving devices, including typewriter and duplicator.

HEALTH SERVICES

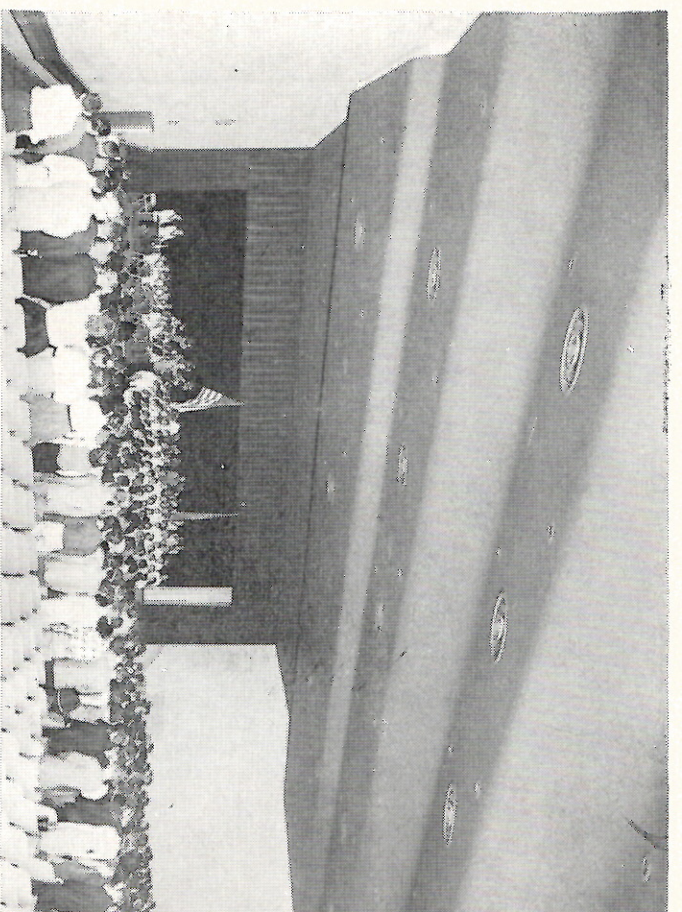

AUDITORIUM

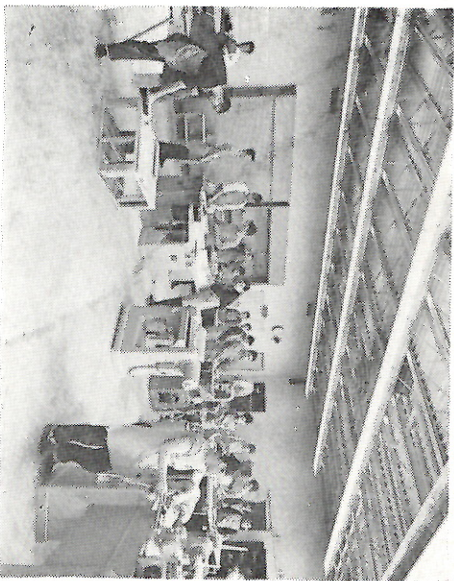
The design of the ceiling and the walls of the Auditorium contribute to its acoustical qualities. The seating capacity is 985. It is to be used for community as well as school activities.

INDUSTRIAL ARTS DEPARTMENT

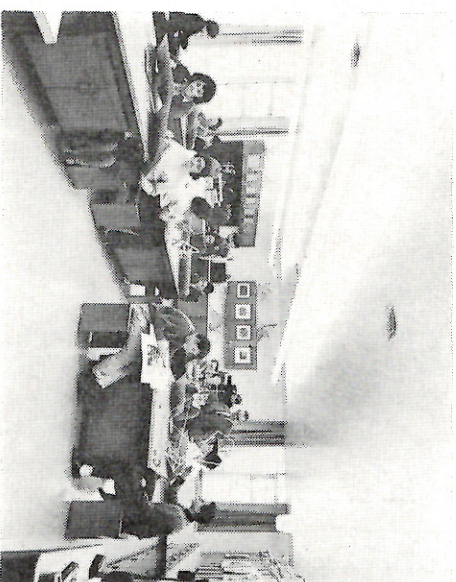

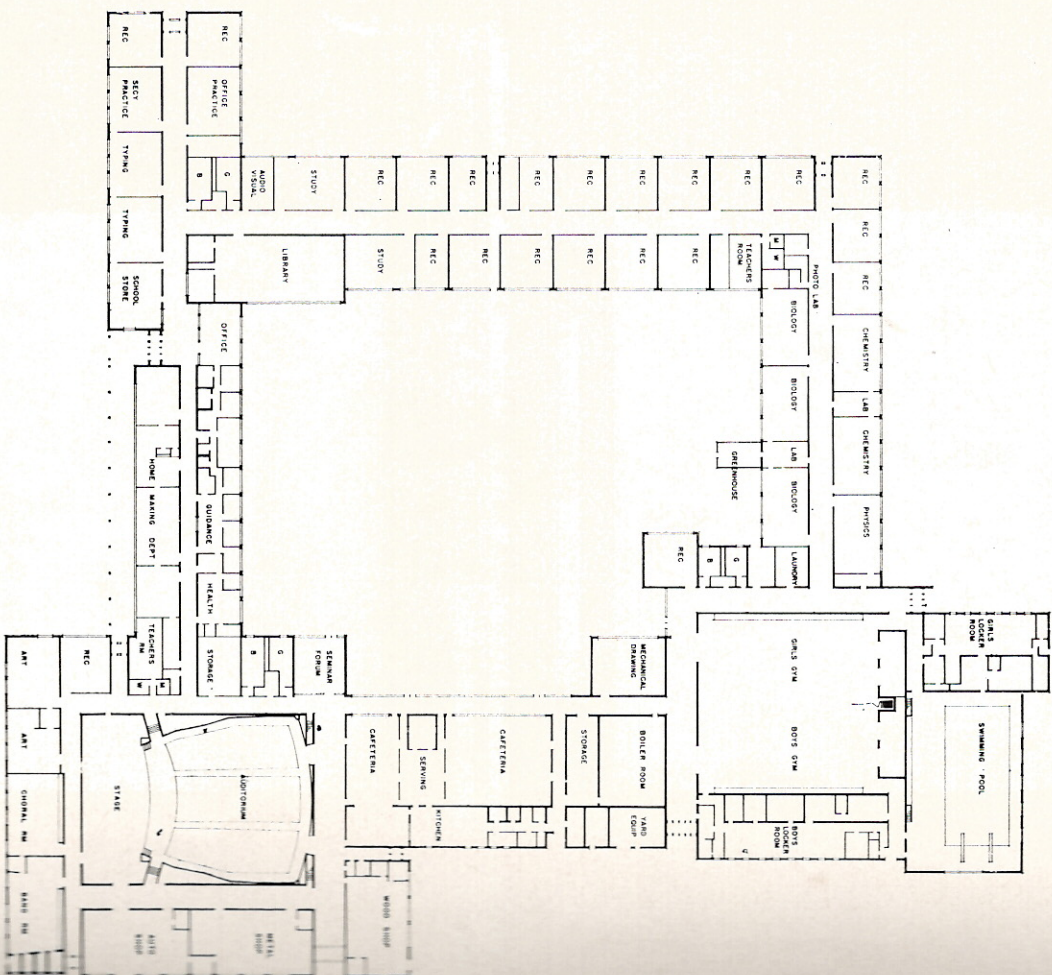

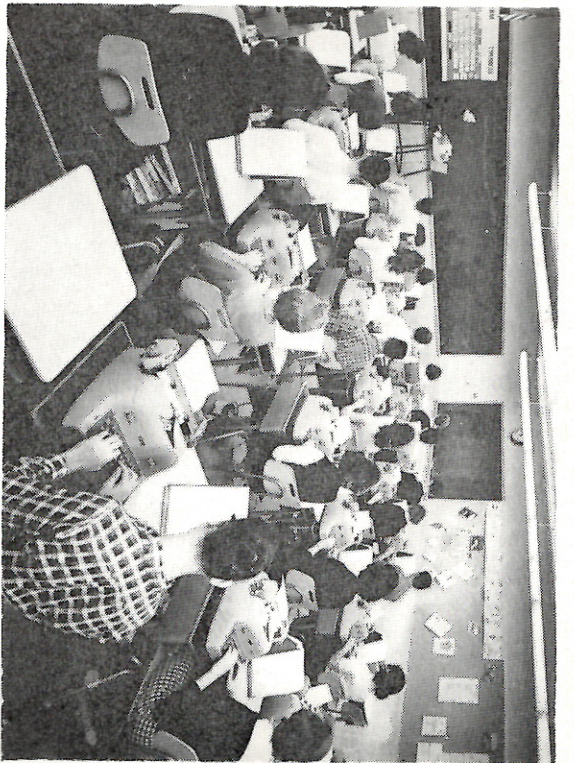

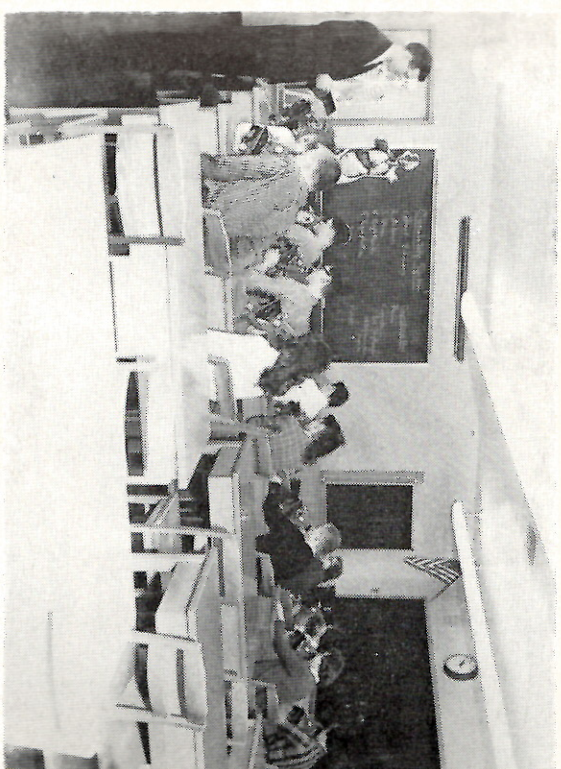


SCIENCE DEPARTMENT

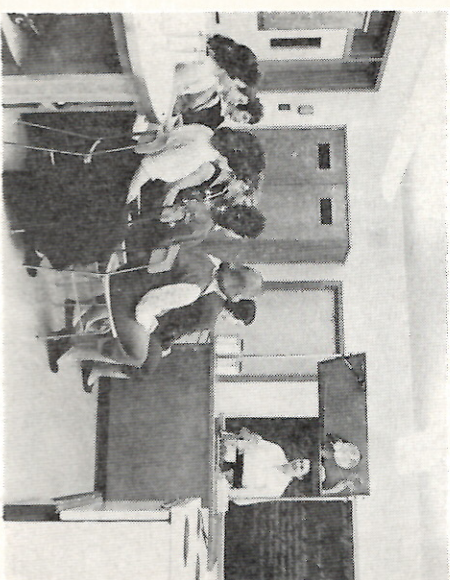

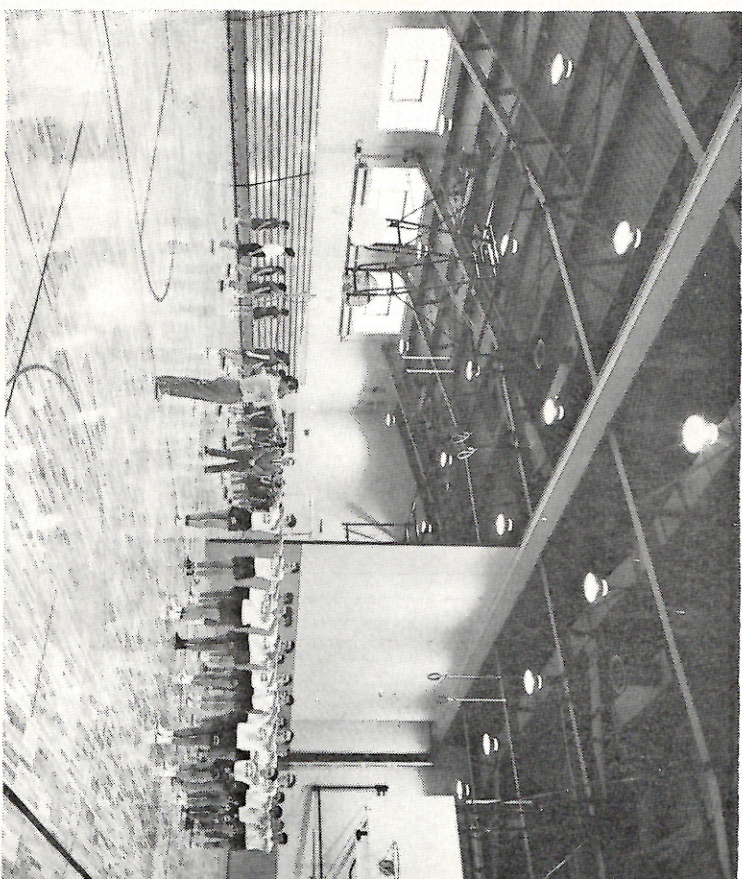
