

TEACHERS' WORKROOM


Three small workrooms are provided for teachers with time saving devices, including typewriter and duplicator.







The Eastridge High School Store serves as a convenient buying center for all students and teachers, and also serves as a laboratory where members of business and retailing classes gain experience in store management and public relations









The Audio-Visual department stores equipment and schedules films for the school. A catalog of films and a previewing room is used by the teaching staff.


