



# COVID-19

## ACTION PLAN

## Overview

1. Fayetteville-Perry Local Schools will assist the Brown County Health Department on the isolation and quarantine process of any individual or student in our school district due to Senate Bill 22.
2. Students/Staff will have the choice to wear or not wear a face mask.
3. A “close contact” and “direct contact” mean the same. It means a student is within 3-feet of the person who has tested positive for accumulation of 15 minutes or longer.

## Case Scenarios

1. If a student/staff member contracts COVID-19, we will follow the Brown County Health Departments guidelines.
2. If a sibling of a student being tested for COVID-19, the sibling will not be quarantined by the Brown County Health Department. It is possible for the family to be quarantined by the Brown County Health Department if the COVID-19 Test Result is positive.
3. A student/staff member within 3-feet of a student and or individual who has tested positive of COVID-19 is considered a close/direct contact.
4. A student/staff member, not wearing a mask, within 3-feet, and is around the COVID-19 positive student, at or longer than 15 minutes, he or she will be quarantined.
5. Any student/staff member who is in quarantine by the Brown County Health Department may come to school after the seventh day with a negative test result and not showing symptoms. He or she may test on or after the fifth day of the close/direct contact.
6. Any student/staff member wearing a face mask properly, meaning covering the nose and mouth, will be exempt from quarantine if considered a close/direct contact.
7. Any student/staff member who is COVID-19 vaccinated will be exempt from quarantine if considered a close/direct contact unless he or she test positive of COVID-19. Vaccinated students/staff members will be required to wear a mask for 10 days and watch for symptoms. If they test negative on day 3-5, they will be allowed to remove their mask. Results will need to be received in the office.

## Staff/Students who are in Quarantine Status

(Updated 10/22/2021)

Close/Direct contacts at school (who do not show signs and/or symptoms of COVID-19) can return or stay at school if they follow one of the following options:

- 1) Wear a mask at school consistently for the 10 days of quarantine and continue to practice social distancing protocol on campus.
- 2) Wear a mask for a 5-day period while in attendance at school and submit a negative COVID-19 test (taken on day 5 and administered by a pharmacy or medical professional) may return to school without a mask on day 6.
- 3) Quarantine outside of the school for the time length assigned by the Brown County Health Department. (See above Case Scenarios)

Parents/guardians and students should monitor for signs and symptoms of COVID-19 daily for 10 days. If signs and symptoms occur, the student should stay home. If signs and symptoms occur at school, the student will be sent home (just like with any other illness).

Note: Fayetteville-Perry Local School District feels this change in policy will allow asymptomatic students to remain in school and take full advantage of their educational opportunities and in extracurricular activities.

## Nurse Responsibilities

- Will collaborate with building principal's recommendations of students who are considered to be a direct/close contact.
- Will collaborate on a daily basis with the Brown County Nurse and determine who is in isolation and quarantine.
- After consultation with the Brown County Health Department, will complete the quarantine letters on behalf of the Brown County Health Department and contact parents.
- For a positive COVID-19 result, send out only a classroom/building notification via Apptegy. It will vary on school building.

## Building Principals Responsibilities

- To enforce that each teacher is practicing social distancing, 3-feet or more, in the classroom to the best of their ability. If needed, assist and conference for teacher guidance.
- Continue to educate and remind teacher/staff members and students on proper personal hygiene; washing hands with soap, social distance when possible, and use hand sanitizer.
- Will complete the contact tracing for their building and report their quarantine recommendations to the district nurse.

## In Conclusion:

- Parents/guardians have decided to enroll their child to Fayetteville-Perry Schools. As done in the past, parents understand the risks of their child contracting a virus, sickness, or even COVID-19. It is each parent/guardian choice to have their child wear or not wear a face mask. It is the same for individuals who have decided to receive or not receive the Chickenpox (Varicella), Diphtheria, tetanus, and whooping cough (pertussis) (DTaP), Haemophilus influenzae type b (Hib), Polio (IPV) (between 6 through 18 months), Pneumococcal (PCV), Hepatitis A (HepA), and Hepatitis B (HepB). This also includes COVID-19. We will do our part to prevent sickness by cleaning and maintaining our buildings, implement effective classroom procedure/management, socially distant students when possible in the classroom/cafeteria, and provide a high quality education.
