

Middle School Dress Code

● Men

- Clean shaven at all times with side burns no longer than the bottom of the ear lobe, and no wider than one inch.
- Hair cannot be over the collar, not colored, nor cut in manner to show distinctive hair lines. There must be tapering between long and short cut sections of hair. No ponytails, mohawks, or spiked hair allowed. Hair must be cut so as not to be touching the eyebrows at any time. Hair may not be colored so as to draw attention or separate you from the rest of the student body.
- Shirts of any kind must be tucked in. All shirts must have sleeves and be buttoned.
- No earrings or spacers allowed. Earrings may not be placed on collars or other visible areas of dress.

● Ladies

- Shirts and tops must cover the entire shoulder area and come down over hips. No midriffs are allowed to be showing at any time. Shirts and tops must be buttoned and cut as to not show cleavage.
- Dresses and skirts must come to 3 inches of the top of the knee.
- Dresses and tops should cover the back.
- Hair may not be colored nor cut so as to draw attention or separate you from the rest of the student body.
- Tights such as yoga pants are not allowed, unless covered by a dress/tunic/top that meets the 3-inch-from-the-knee requirement.

● All Students

- All clothing should reflect respect for themselves and others.
- Hair may not be colored nor cut so as to draw attention or sperate you from the rest of the student body.
- No forms of body piercings other than girls who wear earrings. Visible tape or other coverings of piercings will not be allowed to be worn during the school day.
- No sunglasses or hats worn in building
- Items that depict, describe, or suggest vulgarity, gangs, drug abuse, or advertise alcohol or tobacco products will not be allowed.
- Students are required to wear shoes, but not plastic or rubber flip flops. A flip flop is a shoe that has as its only strap, one that fits between the toes. Students may not wear "slides" or similar footwear. Certain leather sandals may fit the description of a flip flop. Therefore, when in question, a student should check with the principal on the appropriateness of the sandal.
- No PE or athletic shorts allowed. Shorts must be worn within 4 inches of the knee and may not sag. Shorts may only be worn on the last day of the week.
- No visible tattoos
- Jeans or shorts must not have holes of any kind or frays.
- Hats and caps must be worn correctly (not backwards, sideways, etc)
- Contact lenses must be colored a natural eye color and cannot be shaded or shaped with unnatural eye contours or colors.
- Gauges nor any other such device used to enlarge holes in the earlobe or any other part of the skin may be worn.
- Pants/shorts must be worn up and over the hips and the crotch are will not be allowed to sag.
- Students should remember that any time they are expected to travel on field trips, attend extra-curricular activities or any other school sponsored trip or activity, they will have to conform to a dress code specified by the principal, teacher, or coach.
- A student should remember that, before wearing something that might be questionable, check with the principal. The principal is the final authority on all dress code issues.
- Students shall not do anything that might separate themselves from the general population or separate themselves from the general student body.
