How Does Your Child So Home?

"Do I Walk? Bus? Get a Ride?"



There may be days when your child is uncertain of the manner by which they are expected to leave school.

Some days a child may be picked up by a parent or other adult and other days they

may ride the bus or walk. This sometimes causes confusion, especially as we see the fast approach of inclement weather. An example of such confusion is when it is lightly raining and a student is informed by their parent that the student will be picked up when it is raining. It may not be raining where the parent is located and the student waits for a ride.

Please help your child know in advance what is expected of them at the end of the school day. It may be a good idea to create a plan with your child, reinforcing each morning how they are to get home.

Of course, emergencies do happen. When the plan changes during the day, the office is happy to send a parent message to the student. Please call by 2:45 PM to ensure the message is conveyed to your student in a timely manner.

Our goal is to ensure that your child returns home safely and as quickly as possible.

Dropping Off and Picking Up Your Child

We are so big and busy around here that it almost feels like the terminals at SeaTac Airport. To help us be as efficient as the airport, we want everyone on the same page for the arrival and dismissal process. Your help will make the process smooth. It takes all of us, everyday, to make it work! Here are the simple steps:

Be ready. Have your child's backpack and lunch in easy reach, shoes tied, coat on, kisses and hugs taken care of in the driveway at home. This will help keep traffic moving.

Form one line along the curb. The far right lane along the curb is for active loading and unloading of students. The left lane is for cars that have already unloaded and are exiting the school grounds or cars that are going to park in the lot in the morning.

Pull all the way forward, no matter what. Regardless of the child's age that you are dropping off and where they are walking to, please pull ALL THE WAY forward to the speed bump. If your child has to backtrack, the extra steps won't hurt them. ©

<u>Stay in your car.</u> There will be 1-2 staff members at the curb to help open car doors and keep things moving. Under no circumstances should you park and leave your car along the curb. If you need to take more time with your child or have a need to come into the building -- even for just a moment -- please find a parking place and walk in. No exceptions.

No left turns. When exiting the school grounds, there are no left turns permitted during arrival and dismissal. This will allow for easier flow of traffic and the safety of students walking.

The bus and staff lot is not to be used for drop off or pick up. Walking between the buses is not permitted. Please use the car loop or park in the two visitor parking lots and walk to meet your student.

Working together, we can all experience a drop off and pick up that is both SAFE and EFFICIENT.

Hello Marshall Families,

Please let us know if you need clothing assistance for your student(s) and/or weekend food support. We have a few programs in place that are available to support students who qualify for free or reduced lunches:

- Operation School Bell takes clothing assistance applications through the school counselor and will complete orders by filing a bag with new clothing and these are then sent home from the school.
- Clothes for Kids offers clothing assistance as well and needs a completed application from the school and then you can take your child to the center to pick up the clothing.
- Food for Thought is a food bag provided from the Marysville Food Bank. These bags are sent home from school typically on Thursdays or one or two days prior to a holiday.

You can also visit http://marysvillefoodbank.org to sign up for various food programs, including help for Thanksgiving and their upcoming Toy Store.

We do have some hygiene kits, back packs and school supplies as well.
