

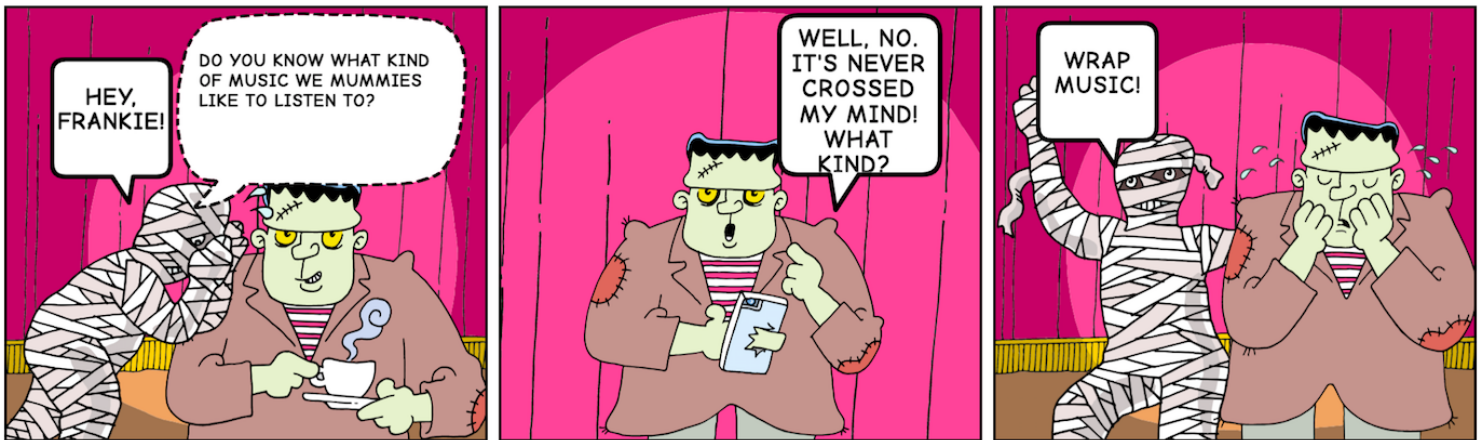

The paper you're reading now is the first issue of this year's Wildcat Life newspaper, but how was it made? Well, I thought I would give you all a little portal into the process of how this is done.

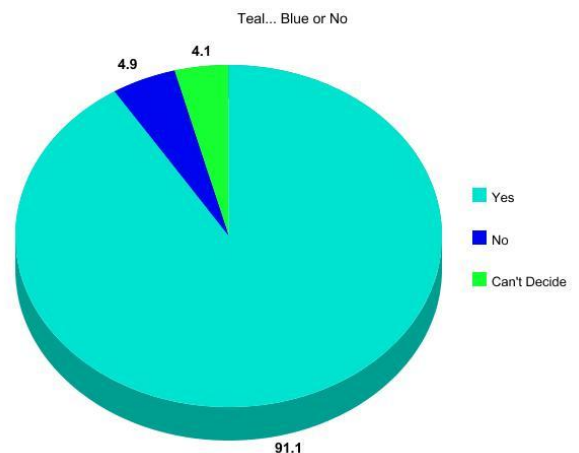
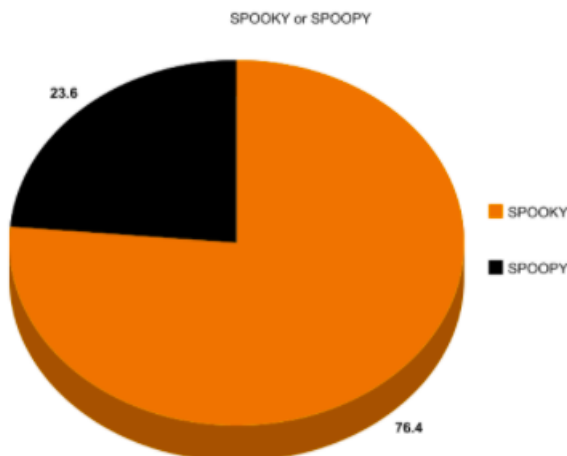
