Approval of Minutes

Frenchtown School Board of Trustees Meeting March 21, 2023 at 7:00 p.m. Middle School Shared Common Area

- I. Call to Order: The Regular School Board Meeting was called to order by Board Chair Jami Romney FitzGerald. Trustees Shiloh Lucier, Bryce Simpson, Jami Wright, Noah Peters, Rainier Batt and Amanda Hansen were in attendance. Also in attendance were Superintendent Les Meyer, Principals Jake Haynes, Aaron Griffin, Riley Devins and Jodi Hall, Assistant HS Principal Beth Terzo, Technology Coordinator James Forrider and District Clerk Shauna Anderson.
- II. Pledge of Allegiance: The meeting opened with the pledge at 7:00 p.m.

III. Board Recognition

The board recognized FHS Basketball programs. Boys Basketball Coach Brandon Robbins discussed this season as the best overall season for boys' basketball in the last 17 years. The boys' team finished fourth at the State tournament, and did a great job representing the school and community. Players Joshua Lucier and Eli Quinn attended. Joshua Lucier discussed the successful season and how the team came together. Girls Basketball Coach Tim Yeager discussed the girls' success, winning the Divisional tournament and a game at State. It has been a pleasure to coach these players. Players Sadie Smith and Maja Skinner attended. Board members asked questions of the coaches and players and congratulated them for their success this season.

IV. Public Comment Period

Damon and Crystal Leisman addressed the board of discuss drug usage in the school and a recompexposure by their student. Mr. Leisman wanted to call attention to the community and the board about this coming into Frenchtown and how drug usage in schools needs to be taken scientify. Ms. Leisman commended Administration for being proactive and asked for the Board's plan moving followerd to address this issue. Trustee Shi ch Lucier discussed public comment for non-agenda item, and explained that the Board cannot converse with the public on non-agenda items. The Leishman's were minked for their time addressing the Board.

V. Individuals and Delegations to Address the Board

Frenchtown Community Coalition representative Reagan Mecham thanked the Leishman's for coming forward with this difficult topic. Ms. Mecham discussed the dangers in the substances that students are exposed to and would like more action to address these dangers. An age specific brief presentation was sent to teachers to show students during National Drug and Alcohol Facts Week. Ms. Mecham was discouraged to hear that not all teachers presented this information. Questions were asked regarding usage in Frenchtown. Anonymous surveys are given to students annually, and the data will show where Frenchtown stands. School districts across the nation are experiencing this and the recent summer conference provided the FCC with valuable tools, much of which was increased disciplinary action. The FCC is looking to schedule speakers for next fall.

VI. Staff Presentation - none.

VII. Approval of Minutes

Jami Wright made a motion to approve the minutes as written. Noah Peters seconded the motion. Public discussion – none. Board discussion – none. Unanimous.

VIII. Administrative Reports

Highlights of the administrative reports were 1) Maintenance Supervisor Sean Mecham discussed the numerous service contracts under review. Spring and summer projects will be underway soon. 2) Technology Coordinator James Forrider acknowledged the benefits of the Meraki AP's to be reviewed later on the agenda. 3) Administrative Reports: Questions were asked about paraprofessional staffing needs.

Currently, all schools are staffed and there are good, dedicated substitutes who have helped tremendously, Elementary Principal Jodi Hall discussed the excellent 98% turnout for parent/teacher conferences. Principal Riley Devins discussed upcoming spring concerts and the hard work of the music department to put these together. Principal Devins acknowledged the technology improvements at the Intermediate School with security cameras added to most areas of the building. MS Principal Aaron Griffin discussed the first round of SBAC testing for 8th grade science, as well as the MS Iron Bronc award and the service component required. Activities Director Eli Field commended the HS basketball teams for their seasons. Spring sports are underway and the first ever FHS baseball game was played tonight. HS Principal Jake Haynes discussed HS registration for next year and the ACT prep for the upcoming ACT test. New HS rankings will be released very soon. Questions were asked about weighted vs. unweighted grade point averages in the HS. FHS values honors and high honors courses. Colleges will unweight GPA's submitted, so these are not used at FHS since transcripts are normalized at the college level. Trustee Shiloh Lucier commended HS Counselor Robyn Richardson for the scholarship postings and availability. 4) Superintendent Les Meyer discussed paraprofessional hiring, with hires on the agenda tonight. The upcoming election is on May 2nd, with ballots mailed April 12th. Also discussed were HB549 and HB562 regarding charter schools. These are similar bills, with the main difference being HB549 requires a charter school to be administered by the Board of Education, whereas HB562 does not, nor does it require charter schools to accept children with disabilities. HB322 creating a statewide health insurance trust was also discussed and has been tabled in committee.

IX. Business

A Business

The negotiations finance committee has notice veral times since last summer. The District has not received an operational mill levy from the community in overall years. The amount received then is and was proportionately larger than the amount the District is asking for in the May election. Superintenden less Moyer recommended the adoption of a resolution to impose an increase in local tax site suppose the general fund in the amount of \$513,551 per year which is approximately 34.44 mills for the purpose of addressing the operational needs of the school district due to again facilities and increased maintenance costs, while retaining and recruiting staff to best serve students and programs. Ballot language was included in the board packet and will be posted to the website. Bryce Simpson made a motion to approve the operational mill levy request as presented. Noah Peters seconded the motion. Public discussion — none. Board discussion — regarding the tremendous amount of work for a long period of time that has gone into this decision. This has not been an easy decision but it necessary at this time and is in the best interest of the District. Unanimous.

B. New Business

- 1) Review/Action: Donation of Winx Brand PlasmaWave Air Cleaners
 Superintendent Les Mayor discussed the donated air cleaners for the

The District is recommending donating these air cleaners to Climate Smart Missoula, who will refurbish them and donate them to people in need. The District recently received air purifiers that replaced these air cleaners. Shiloh Lucier made a motion to approve the donation of Winx Brand PlasmaWave Air Cleaners as recommended. Jami Wright seconded the motion. Public discussion none. Board discussion regarding if the original donors were aware of this donation. Climate Smart Missoula was originally involved in the donation to the District. Unanimous.
- 2) Information/Discussion: Curriculum Review
 - The Curriculum Committee met earlier this evening and are reviewing materials for the ELA curriculum adoption. There will be professional development for this new curriculum at the end of summer. All novels under review for grades 7-12 are available in the Superintendent's office. There are two novels being considered for further review and there are enough copies for board trustees to receive and read the book prior to the next meeting.

Kalispell schools has requested a MOA agreeing to Kalispell Public Schools providing transportation of the FHS HOSA club to the state convention. Superintendent Les Meyer recommended approval of the MOA. Shiloh Lucier made a motion to approve the MOA with Kalispell Schools for HOSA transportation as recommended. Bryce Simpson seconded the motion. Public discussion – none. Board discussion – none. Unanimous.

Administrative Reports

 The IT department has received 70 tickets with 90% closer rate. We have taken care of 100+ troubleshooting requests via email and phone since we last reported in March.

Most of this month has been spent with Blackfoot trying to clean up our network and getting it ready for testing to be carried out. We layered the switches, so only one claims to be the root and the others all line up behind each other. This speeds up the time it takes for packets to be passed down the line and exit to the outside world.

We also found a rouge switch hanging off a wireless point to point out in the crow's nest that wanted to be the root and was causing us some real major issues. We turned it off right now, and are working to clean that all up through a process of steps that we will do after the testing is all done.

We worked with our camera providers to replace three bad cameras and get all of them back up and working correctly. We also escorted three vendors through the high school so that they can work on quotes for an intercom system.

Report to the School Board April 2023 From Jennifer Demmons, Special Services Coordinator

Autism Awareness and Acceptance Month

April is Autism Awareness/Acceptance month. Autism is a developmental condition characterized by restricted or repetitive behaviors or interests, as well as social communication deficits. The latest CDC estimate on autism prevalence in the U.S. is 1 in 36, suggesting that autism "awareness" is at an all-time high. That being said, autism advocacy groups are now also emphasizing the importance of "acceptance."

Autism acceptance is an addition to autism awareness with the goal of making people with autism feel good about who they are without suggesting changes. Often, people mistake autism awareness as a movement to help 'fix' people with autism. This is especially inappropriate for people who are not part of someone's support system, even though many of these ideas are well-intentioned. Autism acceptance is a way of letting the people we care about know that they are welcome to live life without having autism be the focus at every turn (allypediatric.com).

OPI autism specialist Doug Doty drove this point home when he quoted from a book called *Look Me in the Eye*, written by an individual with autism. "Here is a science fact for you neurotypicals. I don't have to look at you to hear you. Those are different physiological systems." Yet, we pound hard at getting children with autism to "show me your eyes."

Intermediate Special Education teacher, Jessica Beers, provided the teachers in her building with some great resources. Here are a couple:

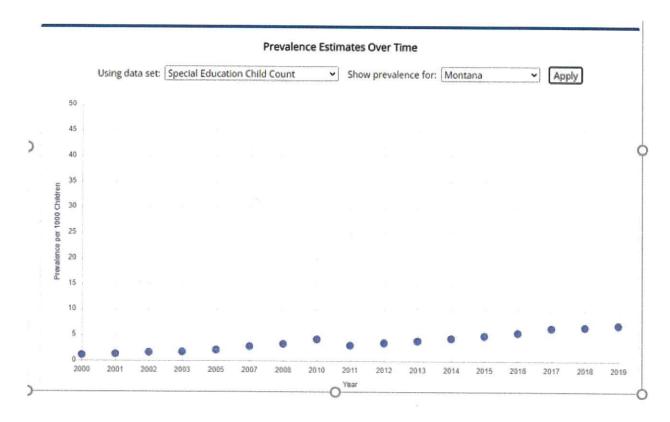

*It is important to note that a medical diagnosis of autism is not the same as identification of autism under the Individuals with Disabilities Act (IDEA). Often, a student will have a medical diagnosis of autism but does not meet IDEA criteria for the autism disability category. To complicate the matter, each state has its own IDEA autism criteria. A child may qualify for special education services under autism in one state and not in another! This can be very confusing and frustrating to parents, so we try hard to help the family navigate the system to the get the student the support needed.

In last month's board report, I showed you a Frenchtown autism evaluation team at work. This month, I have attached our state's autism criteria checklist so you can see some of the behaviors being assessed.

The following graph, found on the CDC website, shows the Montana special education Autism prevalence over time. Again, note this is not the same as a medical diagnosis of autism.



MT percentage rates of students identified under the category of Autism have climbed from 1.1% in 2000 to 7.0% in 2019.

At Frenchtown, our numbers of students with autism, in relation to the total number of students receiving special education services, appear stable over the last 4 years.

Preschool News from Dana Lozier

The preschool recently concluded a unit of study on "construction and building". The students learned about building materials, demolition, tools, pouring concrete, construction vehicles and so much more. The unit included a worksite play area with an architect's desk, blueprints, hard hats, high visibility vests, walkie-talkies, and real tools and lumber. During play you could hear them hammering and talking on the phone about plans for new construction. The children participated in STEM activities as well. They learned the purpose of a bridge. In a fun activity the children were challenged to find materials within the classroom to build a small bridge over pretend water that could hold a small wooden car and plastic person. Each bridge looked completely different and it took some trials, but they were all structurally sound!

In March, students in our MS/HS life skills program buddled up with HS students from Student Council, NHS, and other student organizations to create art depicting the talent and imagination of friends celebrating their similarities and differences together, unified and standing side by side. The paintings were displayed during the Best Buddles and Montana Down syndrome Association World Down Syndrome Day celebration on March 21st. This took place at the Missoula AMC dine-in theater. There, community members were able to view and bid on the art in the lobby. The Red Carpet Evening was followed by a private viewing of the Champions movie (rated PG 13). The entire event celebrated togetherness and the joy of uplifting others.

10.16.3011 CRITERIA FOR AUTISM

A student must have at least one characteristic in each of the three areas of social communication; social interaction; and in restricted and repetitive behaviors and interests.

A student must have a total of eight or more characteristics to be identified as a student with autism.

The characteristics below are those which most frequently occur with the student but may not occur in every situation.

Significant difficulties in social communication must be documented for at least one of the following characteristics:

YES NO	Initiating or maintaining eye contact while interacting with others;
YES NO	Use of facial expressions to communicate with others;
YES NO	Identifying and/or understanding the communicative intent of another person's facial expressions;
YES NO	Using gestures to direct attention to an object (for example: showing, bringing or pointing out objects of interest);
YES NO	Using gestures for communication;
YES NO	Responding to or interpreting other's use of gestures;
YES NO	Noticing or interpreting other's use of body language;
YES NO	Use of own body language for communication;
YES NO	Expressive verbal or alternative communication;
YES NO	Receptive verbal communication; or
YES NO	Interpretation of other's verbal communication (often concrete and literal; for example: does not understand idioms or sarcasm).

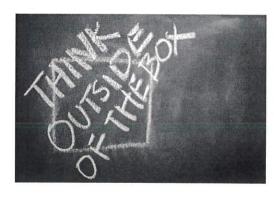

1st grade:



Spring is here! The first graders are still exploring bugs in our classroom and we are loving it. So

far we have got to see the partial transformation of the milkweed bugs. They are in the nymph

stage. We have seen the silkworms hatch from eggs and grow bigger

and we have watched some of the mealworms change from larva to pupa and are excited to watch their next transformation into the darkling beetle. The

first graders are reading leveled stories while working on their comprehension and fluency. They are also learning more phonemic awareness and practicing on their handwriting skills daily. It is



always such a joy seeing the improvement from each student throughout the school year. We appreciate all of the parent support and practice that is happening at home to help our students improve. In math,

the first graders are learning about 2-D and 3-D shapes and learning how to draw lines to separate shapes into 2 equal parts and 4 equal parts. We are also about to begin learning how to add



and subtract double digit equations. We are excited to see the continued growth for the last couple of months of first grade.

2nd Grade:

Spring is FINALLY here! 2nd graders spent the week before spring break learning all about a well known Easter treat, Peeps. They learned about the history of Peeps, conducted science experiments with Peeps, worked on close reads about Peeps, as well as many math activities that involved, you guessed it, PEEPS! These activities were thoroughly enjoyed by the students. In math, we have been learning about adding and subtracting with three digits. It is very helpful if students have their basic simple math facts, up to 10, in place. Students have also been working on determining whether or not to add or subtract in word problems using their prior knowledge with the familiar terms such as how many more, altogether, how many are left, etc. In reading, we are continuing to focus on reading fluently, understanding what we are reading, and reading for enjoyment. Please continue to be on the lookout for information regarding upcoming field trips in your child's Tuesday envelope or Class Dojo. We are looking forward to spending the next few months continuing to watch your children grow and preparing your child for 3rd grade.

3rd Grade:

Where has the time gone! We were just doing parent/teacher conferences and now it's the middle of April. Report cards have gone home and we're in the last stretch of school. Don't forget we do have a PIR day coming up on the 28th.

We're happy to report that there were minimal injuries during the ice skating party, mostly bumps and bruises! We hope you enjoy the picture.

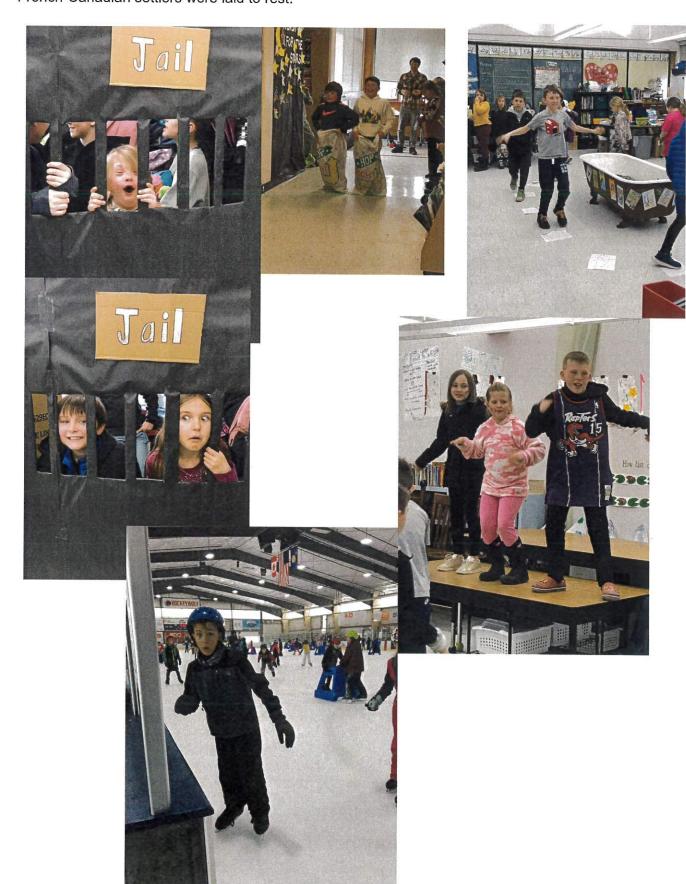

We continue to work through the curriculum in each subject, but are excited to include Frenchtown history this quarter. We will be visiting the historic Nine Mile Ranger Station, talking

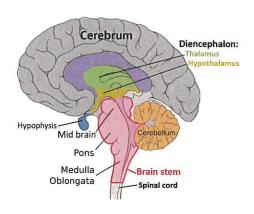
about the Big Fire of 1910, the CCC, and visiting the cemetery where many of the early French-Canadian settlers were laid to rest.

From the desk of Mrs. America:

Students in the K-2nd grade have learned so many things about the power of our brains. The students have learned about the frontal lobe part of the brain, specifically how it helps us in planning, preparing, and solving problems. This executive functioning part of our brain helps us in so many areas of our lives especially in regulating our emotions. Our kids truly understand the function of the frontal lobe and its role in helping us keep our lid on tight. What does that even mean? Keeping our lid means protecting our amygdala. Can you believe



this? Our kindergarten kids know about their amygdala and the role the amygdala plays in emotional dysregulation. We learned about two characters who help us flip our lid fast: the Skunk who willingly delivers stinkin' thinkin' and the Want Monster who only sees what they want----and when they don't get what they want.....kaboom! Lid flipped! Our kids relate to these characters and understand how we protect the amygdala by using our frontal lobe strategies of breathing, talking to a trusted adult, owning our behavior, being honest and trustworthy. Our kids know this stuff! How cool is that! When we have a greater understanding of the function of our brain and the role of our emotions we can better cope and deal with life's upheavals. This is good stuff and our kids are AMAZING! We are about to switch gears into careers (catchy rhyme there). Kids will be strengthening their frontal lobe as they play detective in figuring out different careers. It's going to be F-U-N!

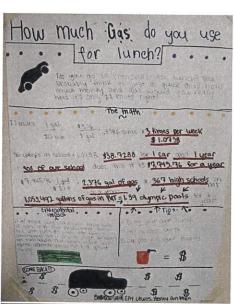

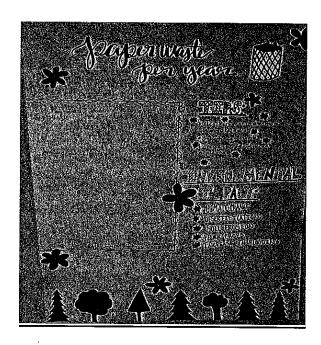
It was a wonderful experience, and we can't wait to attend again next year!

Freshmen Science One Classes

Freshman Science 1 students were studying dimensional analysis and the importance of unit conversion. They investigated how we can use this skill to explore environmental problems. Students paired up and investigated an environmental issue our school is facing. With the help of Mr. Mecham and our school district office, they were able to analyze what issues our school is facing and how we are spending extra money on things we could avoid. Examples of projects were estimation of how much paper teachers use per week, how much plastic bottles are recycled or thrown away, amount of lbs of food wasted at lunch, amount of money parents spend on replacing lost items in the south campus, heat loss that leads to more fuel consumption, flushing of feminine products, commuting (i.e. use of buses v. driving individually, gas used to go to Frenchies at lunch, etc) and water wasted while brushing teeth.







Environmental Science

Our Environmental Science classes participated in the RISE Challenge Big Sky. The goals of RISE Challenge Big Sky are to:

Improve community engagement in developing resilience. When students participate in local problem-solving, their experience is durable. Young people who have experience making their community resilient are more likely to participate as adults and will be more aware of risks and be prepared for future events.

Improve student learning. When asked to solve problems facing their community, students leverage experience, harness internal resources, and apply these lessons to find and implement the best solution. Along the way, there is experimentation, failure, success, and ultimately consequences for actions. This method, where students drive their own learning, is the cornerstone of the deep understanding that young people need in order to thrive in a world driven by change.

Frenchtown Environment Sciences classes took 3 of the 10 finalist spots!

Environmental Science students have also been studying air quality - Many students are using sensors loaned from the REACH (Research Education on Air and Cardiovascular Health) program at the University of Montana to study the air quality in our high school. We integrated new curriculum and wearable PM2.5 monitors into their science classes, enabling students to design their own research projects, collect data, analyze results, and present their findings in public settings.

- REACH engages students in rural and underserved areas to become immersed in science methods through rigorous research projects focused on PM2.5 (fine airborne particles 2.5 microns in diameter and smaller), cardiovascular health, and population health.

Suicide Prevention

The counselors and Tamarack Grief center presented the state approved Signs of Suicide training to 11th graders this past week. The training teaches student to recognize warning signs and risk factors for suicidal ideation while teaching about protective factors and coping skills. Students discussed their own coping skills and were educated about other risk factors outside of mental health concerns such as Sextortion.

During the SOS training students practiced how to ACT: Acknowledge the suicidal ideation, show they Care, and learn how to tell a trusted adult.

Seniors received QPR training which is the state recommended suicice prevention training for adults. Seniors practiced learned various ways to ask if someone is feeling suicidal, learned how to persuade individuals to get help and how to refer them to services. Seniors also learned that not all people who attempt suicide have mental health concerns; sometimes it can be related to other events. Sextortion, life transition and bullying were topics of discussion related to suicidal ideation.

Frenchtown Buddies has started up at Frenchtown High School and has set up opportunities for students in our Life Skills program to meet with other peers! We have Lunch Bunches twice a month where buddies gather together to eat lunch, talk, and sometimes dance! We are also putting on monthly activities for buddies to get together and have some fun. Last month students painted canvases that were auctioned off at the "World Down Syndrome Day Red Carpet Event" put on by the Montana Down Syndrome Association on March 21st. We are looking forward to more fun events to come!

Why do we need to pass an Operational Mill Levy?

- integrated part of the funding formula as Local levy elections are a necessary and designed by the Legislature. •
- School Districts cannot deficit spend, and must operate within the general fund budget limits set by the state.
- The District buildings vary in age from 1959 to buildings. As building age, the cost to operate, 2009, including two temporary classroom repair and maintain them increases.

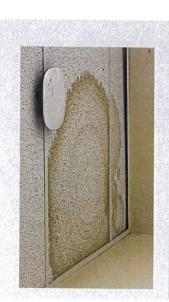

What is the General Fund responsible for?

The costs for maintenance, repairs and operations are paid out of the general fund. This is the same source of money that pays for staffing, curriculum, extra-curricular programs and activities, music, the arts, early kindergarten, industrial, business and agriculture education, gifted and talented, special programs and fixed costs. In other words, all things that make Frenchtown school great!

Tell us about school funding

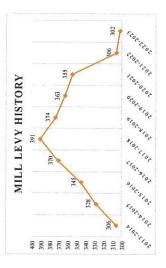
- State and federal funding provide most, but not all, of the total dollars needed to operate public schools.
- Local funding obtained through levies help bridge the gap between state and federal funding and the actual cost to run a school district.
- Schools receive money for each student served, \$5,962 for each K-6 student and \$7,634 for each 7-12 student.
- In 2022-23, the financial benefit of having out-of-district students is \$736,076, 6.7% of the general fund budget.
- Out-of-district students do not cause an increase in staff needs.

When was the last time an operations levy passed?

• 2006-2007—the voted levy amount has not changed in 16 years.

Mill Levy History

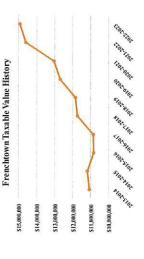
The taxpayer obligation to the school district has decreased each year since 2017-2018.



Area growth impact on this levy

- The County Assessor determines the taxable value, not the market value, of each home and the Frenchtown area as a whole.
- As the taxable value of Frenchtown increases, the value of a mill increases and the number of mills necessary to fund a levy <u>decreases</u>.

In other words, as Frenchtown grows, there are more taxpayers in the community sharing the tax burden. More taxpayers reduce mills for all of us!



How much of the general fund comes from local taxpayers?

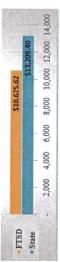
 In 2022-2023, local taxpayers funded 17.88% of the general fund budget.

How does this compare to other schools?

 The State average is 28.99% of the general fund budget from local taxpayers.

How does Frenchtown School District compare with the state average spending per student?

Frenchtown School District's average spending per student is well below the state average.

LEGISLATIVE NEWS Monday, April 17

<u>HB 393</u> - Establish the Students with Special Needs Equal Opportunity Act – public dollars to allow students with disabilities to attend a private school with no regulation or guidance on how the money is spent.

<u>HB 549</u> - Authorizing establishment of public charter schools – this bill is in line with Title 20 which provides protections to students, families, staff, and voters.

<u>HB 562</u> - Authorize establishment of community choice schools – not subject to the provisions of Title 20. It would be a for profit or would allow a for-profit education company for education services.

Wednesday, April 19

HB352 would transform Early Kindergarten programs into a targeted intervention program. Students would be identified as those students who are not on track to read at grade level by 3rd grade. Schools could still serve 4 y/o students under this program with an understanding that schools would identify those students who are in need of extra support to be on track to read at grade level by 3rd grade. HB352 has not yet passed the legislature. It has been supported all the way through, but we are hearing that the finance committee may stall this bill and if that is the case, then Early K will be in jeopardy. It will pass the Senate Education and Cultural Resources Committee.
