REGULAR MEETING SEPTEMBER 27, 2021

PRINCIPAL'S REPORTS:

CENTRAL

- ▶ Students have been participating in beginning of the year assessments in Reading and Math this past month for NWEA, Acadience, Walpole differentiated reading instruction, and Words Their Way spelling inventories. Utilizing this data, we have established differentiated instruction plans for all students Kindergarten through 2nd grade. The state-approved assessment that MAPS uses for student growth shows that our students are currently at the following: Kindergarten: Math 72% at or above grade level, Reading 69% at or above grade level, 1st Gr: Math 70% at or above grade level, Reading 68% at or above grade level, Reading 59% at or above grade level.
- ▶ Kelly King and Randi Ahrndt wrote an anti-bullying grant last spring to train teachers and students on the START peer-to-peer mentoring program at Central Elementary. We were awarded \$6900 to incorporate an anti-bullying program at our school this school year. We will be planning professional development for staff, and begin assigning/training "buddies" for our students who need a little extra support in social situations before the 2nd Quarter.
- ▶ Teachers have begun scheduling Parent/Teacher conferences for the school year which are scheduled October 12 and 13th. We will be using "sign-up genius" to schedule 15 minute time slots electronically for families. In addition, parents will be asked to use the courtyard doors when entering the classrooms for their scheduled conference time.
- ♦ We are still trying to incorporate more health and wellness into our school community this school year. We have applied for the Building Healthy Communities grants again this year to hopefully help fund a walking club at Central, healthier food choices during breakfast/lunch, and additional staff wellness incentives. Utilizing physical activity during academics increases memorization and comprehension, and we hope to gain resources to help us increase activity for all students and staff at Central this school year.

BLESCH

- ▶ We have completed all of our beginning of the year testing.
- ▶ Blesch will be completing grade level meetings this week to discuss results of student testing.
- ▶ Blesch teachers have started small group instruction as part of their primary block of instruction. Small group instruction will be taking place in the content areas of Math and ELA. By incorporating small group instruction into our primary blocks of ELA and Math, we are hoping to help minimize learning gaps that have been created. Daily formative assessments will be driving our small groups.
- ▶ Blesch will be hosting Parent-Teacher Conferences on October 5 & 6.
- ▶ Teaching staff had the opportunity to teach self-selected content on our half day of school. This idea came from the book, "Significant 72: Unleashing the Power of Relationships in Today's Schools".
- As a continuation of previous years, all staff at Blesch have selected 5-7 students that they would like to regularly check in with (3 times a week). We are doing this in hopes of continuing to build a building wide community.
- ▶ Blesch staff would like to offer their deepest condolences to the Man's family. Mr. Mans was a leader who was student focused and his passion for putting students first will not be forgotten. He is a man who positively impacted thousands of students' lives.

JR/SR HIGH

- ▶ 7th-10th grade students are finishing up their NWEA testing. Students were tested in Math, English, Science and Grammer. They will also be tested in the winter and spring.
- ▶ There are plans to have students participate in an intervention program based on their NWEA scores.
- As mentioned earlier, College Day was cancelled, but students have been able to access information about Universities and Colleges by other means like zoom meetings.
- Teachers participated in professional development on our early release. It focused on SEL, CTE, and Special Ed Law.

- ▶ Parent/Teacher conferences are coming up on October 6th & 7th.
- ▶ A full day PD is scheduled for Oct 8. Focus will be to continue to improve our SEL, and it is also UP Special Ed Conf.

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SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

▶ Thank you to DeeAnne Pohlmann, Scott Martin, and Randi Ahrndt for applying and receiving ELF Grant. The district

received \$106,000 for computers and \$14,500 for hot spots.
