## What is it?

In support of strengthening academic achievement, Bethune
Middle School receives Title I, Part A funds and therefore must

the school's expectations for parent and family engagement and describes how the school will

## How is it revised?

Bethune Middle School invited all parents to attend our Title I Input Meeting, Revision Meeting, and our Title I Informational Meeting, to review and revise this parent and family engagement plan, as well as the school wide plan, our school-parent compact and the family engagement budget. Additionally, a survey was sent home to all parents for them to provide specific feedback to the school, and parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online form. The plan is posted on our school Web site for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online, by email, and sent home with students to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for parental involvement. Parents can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year.

## Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Bethune Middle will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities, parents of migratory children, and parents of homeless students, as required under Section 1111 of the ESSA in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request, and to the extent practicable, in a language parents understand.

## Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is distributed to parents at our Title I Annual Meeting and a copy is sent home with each student in their first report card. The plan will also be posted on the school Web site. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center.

### 2021-2022 District Goals

- Increase the percentage of students designated as developing or higher on the ELA GMAS from 72% to 75% in 2022.
- Increase the percentage of students designated as developing or higher on the Math GMAS from 74% to 77% in 2022.

#### 2021-2022 School Goals

- Increase by 1% the students scoring Proficient or higher on the ELA GMAS compared to 2021
- Increase by 1% the students scoring Proficient or higher on the Math GMAS compared to 2021
- Increase by 1% the students scoring Proficient or higher on the Science GMAS compared to 2021
- Decrease by 2% the number of student discipline referrals and students missing 6 or more days, and increase parent/teacher contacts
- 100% of core content teachers (ELA, Math, Science, Social Studies) will use appropriate, current, instructional technology.

# **School-Parent Compacts**

Parents are invited to play a fun math game with their child under the direction of the child's math teachers to show how math can be used in daily life.

Parents are invited to participate with their child in the completion of a STEM project in compliance with the Georgia Standards of Excellence.

- That parents are full partners in their child's education and are included, as appropriate, in decision-making and on advisory committees to assist in the education of their child.


**Bethune Middle is Branching Out!**

- ✓ Provide frequent trainings for staff during their faculty meetings on new strategies to improve communication with parents and ideas to increase family engagement. Staff will also share best practices during regularly scheduled faculty meetings.
- ✓ Partner with Folkston Elementary School and Charlton County High School by conducting joint meetings for parents and sending school information about parent engagement activities to help prepare parents and their child for fourth grade and high school and to improve school transitions.
- ✓ Share information in English and Spanish in the school newsletter for parents to understand the school's academic standards and assessments as well as the ways parents can monitor their child's progress and work with educators.
- Communicate with all families and the community on a regular basis regarding school wide events and activities, through phone messages, social media, and flyers.
- ✓ Work with our parents to develop relevant trainings and helpful presentations to educate our staff on the importance of family engagement and how to support student learning.
- ✓ Provide necessary materials and handouts for parents at conferences, meetings, and activities to help parents work with their child to improve their child's achievement.

Parents will be provided information with regards to GA Milestones, state standards, and the school curriculum at various parental meetings and through paperwork sent home throughout the school year.






# **School Community Team**
