# Gunter Middle School 

 ERENEE
Concepts learned in one grade level often carry over to the next grade level. The use of the equipment may be for the same purpose, but the concepts go further in depth.

For example, 5th grade scientists in Mrs. Bon's class spent some time testing the properties of several objects. They tested the mass with a triple beam, looked at the physical state, checked for magnetism, tested for electrical conductivity, used water to check for solubility, and determined relative density by watching it float or sink. These students were learning so many skills that will transfer to their future science classes ... like 6th grade!
6th graders $\smile$ density! Students are able
 to remember the formula for density: mass divided by volume because the top of a heart looks like an "m" and the bottom of the heart looks like a "v." They were able to put all of their density knowledge to work today in the lab. Students had 6 objects that they had to calculate mass and volume for before they could calculate the density. Some objects required the displacement method to find volume while others they used the formula: length x width x height. Students then calculated density to determine the material and to see if it would float in water.


## Food Science

Scientists in Mrs. Morrison's lab learned that chemistry plays a huge part in making S'more's. That ooey, gooey campfire creation goes through many physical and chemical changes while it is being created. From the breaking of the graham cracker to the melting of the marshmallow and chocolate, many different reactions were witnessed.
The students also became part of the breakdown of the elements when they ate it ... yum!

## The Pright Side of Learning



Ms. Loewen's class recently studied Vincent Van Gogh, his paintings, and the special Van Gogh exhibit. The class then had a Van Gogh experience in art with Mrs. Harden. The students completed their own "Sunflower" arts \& craft activity with peer support from Mrs. Harden's $2^{\text {nd }}$ period art class. The sunflowers represented each students unique interpretation of Van Gogh's "Sunflower" painting and they were excited to exhibit their finished project!

The middle school STEAM classes are off to a great start. They have immersed themselves into design and construction.
$7^{\text {th }}$ Grade classes have been learning about science, technology and math through interactive lessons and models in hurricane-proof housing, understanding seismographs, and experiencing volcanoes.
$8^{\text {th }}$ Grade classes have taken a different approach on science and technology, math and even history through investigations and models of pirate ships, cantilevers, and skyscrapers. Did you know today, piracy is an $\$ 18$ Billion industry!

## Making Math Meaningful

Students in Mr. Scoggins' Algebra 2 classes researched information on how to buy a vehicle online. They selected an occupation, took the median gross salary for that occupation, and calculated $35 \%$ of the salary to determine how much
 money they had available to purchase/finance a vehicle. Then, they selected a vehicle based on their available vehicle funds, determined the taxes and fees, and then set up their down payments and how much they were to finance through a 4, 5, or 6-year loan.
 Afterwards, they determined the depreciation value of the vehicle over the course of 6 years and finished off the project by answering questions about their
 experience working through the project.


## GHS - CSI

In Precalculus, Mr. Scoggins' students worked through how basic trigonometry is used in collecting data/ evidence from a crime scene. The students were set up with two types of crime scenes based on the blood
 splatter patterns and distance from the blood splatter to the area of convergence. The different blood splatter patterns and their angles of impact helped students determine if the trajectory of the bullet traveled upwards or downwards. This information would then help the students make valid interpretations of the shooter's and victim's height and/or position in the scene.
