



Read Alouds

Reading Aloud to Young Readers at Home

Reading aloud to your child at home is a great way to demonstrate the importance of reading, as well as model an appropriate pace in reading.

Getting Started

- 1. Select a Book Picture books are a great way to start!
- 2. <u>Picture Walk</u> Show a few of the pictures from the beginning and middle of the book before you begin actually reading the book. Skim the words on the page and point out any words that may be unfamiliar to your child.
- 3. <u>Begin Reading</u>
 - For very young readers they just need to listen and look at the pictures.
 - Encourage K-1 aged students to follow along as you point at each word while you read.
- 4. <u>Ask Questions</u> As you're reading ask your child why a character is doing something or what they think will happen at the end of the story.
- 5. <u>Read It Again</u> Read it to the student again and continue to encourage them to read (even if it's just memorized) with you. If they're beginning to do some easy reading on their own, have them try a few pages alone but be ready to assist as needed.
- 6. Read It Again Follow up by reading the book again a day, week, or month later!
- 7. Ask More Questions Encourage them to THINK about what happened in the story, the order the events took place, if there was a problem how was it solved, or how did the characters feel about what happened. On Non-Fiction (fact) books have them notice how the book was organized (chapters or headings).
