

PATHWAY'S TO LICENSURE AMERICAN BOARD CANDIDATE PROFILE

A provisional license can be granted to those who meet the following requirements:

- The individual possesses a bachelor's degree
- The individual successfully complted an alternative teacher certification program through the American Board for the Certification of Teacher Excellence

POST BACCALAUREATE PATHWAY

This is for a college graduate with a bachelor's degree looking to make a career change to transition to education. Through this pathway, you would find a preparation program and complete all the requirements of the approved teacher licensure program. Locally, this can be done through the College of Menominee Nation for K-9, Elementary/Middle School.

ALTERNATIVE ROUTE PROGRAM PATHWAY

This pathway applies to those with a Bachelor's degree majoring in one of the following license subjects: mathematics, science, career and technical education subjects, business education, world languages, special education, bilingual/bicultural and ESL. If this applies you to, you would find a preparation program and complete all the requirements of the approved alternative route licensure program.

BACHELOR'S DEGREE PATHWAY

For candidates who are high school graduates but have no Bachelor's degree, returning adult student, and looking for their first teaching license in WI.

If you fall within this pathway, you will determine what you're interested in teaching and find, apply, and complete a bachelor's degree and requirements of a teacher licensure program. There are programs available locally through College of Menominee Nation for Elementary/Middle School Education!


