Things to Know

WHAT WE ARE LEARNING

Math

- This week in Math we will be learning about perimeter and finding the perimeter and area of shapes. We will also be learning our x3 multiplication facts.

Science

- This week in science we will continue learning about energy and electricity. Students will build simple open and closed electrical circuits, and discuss the difference of them and what changed with an open and closed circuit.

Social Studies:

- We are learning about natural disasters and how they may affect humans. Students will begin researching a natural disaster and write about it during writing.
