On "Apply to College Day," if you would like to fully participate in the FAFSA workshop, you will need to bring:

- Social Security Number (parent and student if applicable)
- Driver's License (if any)
- Most recent W-2 forms and any other records of money earned
- Most recent year's Federal Income Tax Return—IRS Form 1040, 1040A, 1040EZ, or 1040 Telefile
- Most recent year's untaxed income records—Social Security, TANF, welfare, or veteran's benefits records (if applicable)
- Most recent year's bank statements
- Most recent year's business and investment mortgage information, business and farm records, stocks, bonds, and other investment records (if applicable)
- Alien registration card (if you are not a U.S. citizen)

If you do not wish to bring this information, you can still start your FAFSA. You will have to finish it at home.
