

*A student's lunch period is determined by their 2nd block teacher. (First Lunch: 10:40am-11:10am Second Lunch: 11:20am-11:50am)

Ninth grade students at Westside High School will be enrolled in eight classes. Four classes will be academic core classes, such as English, Math, Science, and Social Studies. Three classes will be elective courses requested by the student, and lastly, the final class will be P.E. and Health (one semester each). P.E. and Health are required by all Westside High School students for graduation, and it is recommended that students meet that requirement in the 9th grade. All of the classes offered for 9th grade students, except Study Hall and aide periods, will be taken for high school credit. It is important to know that high school credit courses will appear on the student's permanent high school transcript, and the 9th grade student's final grades will be taken into account when/if determining honor graduate status. A Westside High School student must have 24 credits in order to qualify for graduation. The breakdown of the required credits can be found in the student handbook. In addition, each year, a student must meet the minimum requirement of credits in order to move up in grade classifications. The credit requirements for each grade are as follows:

10th Grade - 6 credits 11th Grade - 12 credits 12th Grade - 18 credits

If a student does not have the minimum credit requirements needed for a certain grade, the student will be classified in the lower grade until additional credits are acquired.

Students are required to make-up any failed high school credit course if the failed course is needed towards graduation. Credit recovery can occur through summer school or the following school year. If it is planned for the following school year, the make-up course will take the place of an elective course. Please know if a student continually fails courses and is not consistently progressing towards graduation, it may be recommended that the student attend SUCCESS Academy for credit recovery throughout the semester/school year.

Enhanced courses (formerly PreAP Courses) are offered to 9th grade students in the subjects of English, Science, and Social Studies. Enhanced

courses cover the same curriculum as regular 9th grade core courses, but Enhanced courses are designed to prepare students for higher intellectual engagement. In addition, summer work may be required for Enhanced courses. These courses will prepare students for the honors program at Westside High School, but they are not required. Summer work will be posted to the school's website, <u>www.westsideschools.org</u>, by June 1st. Summer work must be completed by the student and submitted to the teacher by the deadline in order for students to remain in the Enhanced course. If the summer work is not completed and submitted on time, the student will be removed from the Enhanced course and placed in the regular education course of that subject.

Class schedules for 9th grade students with IEPs will be created based on the recommendations of the student's Special Education team. Special Education students are encouraged to complete a Course Request Form, but the finalized schedule will have to be approved by the appropriate stakeholders.
