Tenth grade students at Westside High School will be enrolled in eight classes. Four classes will be academic core classes, such as English, Math, Science, and Social Studies, and four classes will be requested elective courses. All of the classes offered for 10th grade students, except Study Hall, aide periods, and athletics after the 1st year, will be taken for high school credit. It is important to know that high school credit courses will appear on the student's permanent high school transcript. and the 10th grade student's final grades will be taken into account when/if determining honor graduate status. Please see the WHS Student Handbook for more information.

A Westside High School student must have 24 credits in order to qualify for graduation. The breakdown of the required credits can be found in the student handbook. In addition, each year, a student must meet the minimum requirement of credits in order to move up in grade classifications. The credit requirements for each grade are as follows:

10th Grade - 6 credits 11th Grade - 12 credits 12th Grade - 18 credits

If a student does not have the minimum credit requirements needed for a certain grade, the student will be classified in the lower grade until additional credits are acquired.

Students are required to make-up any failed high school credit courses if the failed course is needed towards graduation. Credit recovery can be achieved through summer school or during the following school year. If it is planned for the following school year, the make-up course will take the place of an elective course. Please know if a student continually fails courses and is not consistently progressing towards graduation, it may be recommended that the student attend SUCCESS Academy for credit recovery throughout the semester/school year.

Enhanced courses (previously PreAP courses) are offered to 10th grade students in the subjects of English and Science. Enhanced courses cover the same curriculum as regular 10th grade core courses, but Enhanced courses are designed to prepare students for higher intellectual engagement. These courses will prepare students for the honors program at Westside High School. Enhanced English 10 and Enhanced Biology are required for all WHS students who want to graduate with honors. Summer work may be required for these courses, and if it's assigned, summer work will be posted to the school's website, www.westsideschools.org, by June 1st. Summer work must be completed by the student and submitted to the teacher by the deadline in order for students to remain in the honors course. If the summer work is not completed and submitted on time, the student will be removed from the honors course and placed in the regular education course of that subject.

Tenth grade students are eligible to take elective courses at the NEA Career and Technical Center at Jonesboro High School. These courses are included in the student's schedule and will take the place of 3 elective courses. Our students who take courses at NEACTC travel to the center everyday by bus and take classes there during our third and fourth block class periods. Then, they return to WHS campus by bus in time for their fifth block class. Students who take courses at NEACTC have the opportunity to take elective courses for concurrent college credit, compete in competitions for scholarships, and acquire certifications in different job areas. If you are interested in taking courses at NEACTC during the 2020-2021 school year, please complete a NEACTC Registration Form, which is attached at the end of the course selection guide, and bring it to the WHS High School office.
