Background

- With the permission of the Board, District Administration and Educators have been evaluating extending the Standards Based Assessment and Reporting (SBA&R) to the Middle School and High School. SBA&R has been implemented in the elementary school for several years.
- The District has had two open community forums to share and seek information from the community regarding SBA&R.
- Administration and Educators have been working diligently to research and respond to questions and comments from the community and build systems to assure rigor to SBA&R, if implemented.
- The Board has been asked to publicly announce its position regarding SBA&R.

Resolutions

- The Board recognizes that it is critical that students, parents and educators have clearly defined learning objectives with student assessments specifically tied to those learning objectives.
- The Board supports continued development of SBA&R practices and refining of SBA&R which would include a high school 4.0 grading system.
- The Board supports full implementation of SBA&R upon completion of a thorough vetting process.
- The Board acknowledges and appreciates the diligence and dedication of our administration and educators on behalf of our students focused on the District's Vision and Mission in their consideration of SBA&R.
- The Board also acknowledges and appreciates the great community support for this district and public education within our district. The community raised their comments and questions for SBA&R, while sharing a genuine concern for their children, our students.

Preventing the Summer Slide

Can you believe we only have a little over two weeks before school is out for summer?! It has been a fantastic year at the elementary school. Lots of learning took place and friendships formed and I am sure there will be tears shed as we say "see ya later" on June 1st. Just because school is out for summer doesn't mean learning has to or should stop. Many times in the summer students go through a summer slide. It's not the slide that you go down at the park or into a pool. The summer slide is the slide of academic levels. Research tells us that on average, students' achievement scores declined over the summer by one month's worth of school-year learning. Students and teachers have worked so hard all year to grow in their learning that we don't want that to slide away. Here is what you can do over the summer to prevent the "summer slide": 1. Six books to summer success -- Research shows that reading just six books a week during the summer months may keep a reader from regressing. When choosing the books, be sure they are good-fit books - not too hard, not too easy. Take advantage of our library summer reading programs. (It sounds like it is going to ROCK!) 2. Read SOMETHING EVERY DAY -- Encourage your child to take advantage of every opportunity to read. (newspapers, magazines, signs, books) 3. Keep reading aloud -- Reading aloud benefits all children and teens. One benefit is that you can read books your child may not be able to, so they will build listening comprehension skills with grade-level and above books. This will increase their knowledge and expand their experience with text, in turn they will do better when they read on their own. These simple suggestions will hopefully be easily to fit into an already busy summer schedule and make it easier to avoid the summer slide and prepare your student to learn again come next academic year. Thank you again for a great year and we hope you have a fun summer.

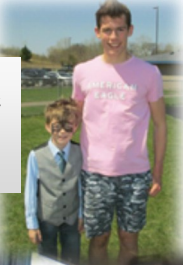

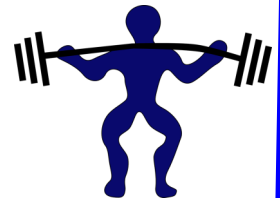

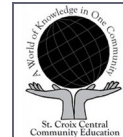

Apply online NOW!

From the WI Dept. of Revenue (DOV) all WI residents are now eligible to apply online for a child tax credit rebate. It is a \$100.00 rebate for sales and use tax paid on purchases made for raising a dependent child in 2017.

You may claim \$100.00 for each qualified child.

A qualified child must be:

- * Under age 18 on December 31, 2017
- * A dependent of the claimant for tax year 2017
- * A WI resident on December 31, 2017
- * A United States citizen

How do you claim your \$100.00 (per child) Child Sales Tax Rebate?

Go to childtaxrebate.wi.gov where you will find more details, frequently asked questions and information. You can apply for the Child Sales Tax Rebate online 24/7 from May 15th through July 2nd.
