## GUIDELINES FOR REHEARSALS

- 1) Each student will sanitize hands upon entering the auditorium.
- 2) Students will not leave the auditorium until they are dismissed from rehearsal.
- 3) All rehearsals will be closed (no friends, parents, siblings, etc will be allowed in to watch rehearsals)
- 4) Students will be told to bring their own water bottles and have them filled before rehearsal, as they will not be leaving until dismissal.
- 5) Only the director and assigned tech students will touch the sound and light boards. Sanitizer will be kept in the booth for frequent application.
- 6) Sanitizer will be backstage for students to apply when they exit the stage and when they enter the stage.
- 7) Equipment and set pieces will be sanitized at the end of each rehearsal by techs, actors and actresses will sanitize their props and place any costume worn during rehearsal in the bin to be washed by the director.
- 8) Cast and crew are expected at all rehearsals they are listed for on the rehearsal schedule for each play. If you are going to miss a rehearsal, it must be approved by the director BEFORE the day of the rehearsal. If you have more than 3 unexcused absences, your understudy will be pulled and you will not be allowed to perform.
- 9) I will work around all athletics and extracurricular activities, but I MUST have those schedules in advance so that I may plan the rehearsal schedule.
- 10) Theatre is a safe place. A place to leave the world and all its problems behind our closed doors. If you bring drama or bullying or unnecessary chaos onto the stage of safety, you will be asked to leave. There will be no second chances. Theatre is a family, a group that works together to tell a story, to put on a show. You don't have to like each other, but you will respect each other or leave.
