Dan Ninham shares Indigenous Games



The American Indian Parent Advisory Council has arranged for Coach Dan Ninham to come next week to spend time with Physical Education classes and teach Indigenous Games. Dan Ninham is Wolf Clan from the Oneida Nation in Wisconsin. A thirty-five-year middle school physical education teacher, he has worked in New Mexico, Wisconsin, and in Bemidji. He has his Ph.D. in Physical Education with an emphasis in sport pedagogy at the University of Northern Colorado.

He has been inducted into the National Indian Athletic Activities Hall of Fame, has received many honors including state middle level physical education teacher of the year, a state boys basketball coach of the year, Outstanding Alumni Bemidji State and is inducted into the National Athletic Hall of Fame. Dan started the Northern Minnesota Lacrosse and Northern Indigenous Lacrosse programs. Dan also does Professional Development with Teachers on using indigenous pedagogy in the classroom.

The students enjoyed their time with Dan last week. South Point's time was rescheduled due to the school cancelation. Dan will be back at South Point on December 8th.
