# **Grants Updates:**

- Promising Futures Grant:
  - Will be assessing fidelity to MTSSB model this spring to inform priorities for 2022-23 school year
  - o trained 7 students from Franklin as well as 10 students from other schools
    - Franklin students are designing their own t-shirts and working on mental health and suicide awareness
    - Group is a wide range of students who have had their own experiences and are passionate about their messaging

  - o in senate there is a bill that will make collecting that data more difficult
  - o will make getting grants more challenging without that data

# Eileen O'Grady

- asked about how this group has impacted everyone's work
- Kandyce shared about the development of the vaping protocol work that was done when that become an issue in the schools
  - a lot of collaboration helped address that issue and create a system to address
    the issue
  - work helped alleviate some of the original repercussions that were not helpful in the process
  - provided opportunity for change
  - provided a shift from punitive to restorative
  - planned National Night Out in Franklin
    - everyone in the group was a part of it this time
    - over 600 people attended
    - having it again this year
- Kristen shared the growth of the program

- two different roles and as a parent
- offering programs/ have gone above and beyond to bring resources to the students and the families
- bringing everyone together to deal with similar issues collaboratively
