Our kindergarten through second-grade students participate in this program daily. Instruction during acceleration utilizes this program to remediate decoding issues. For several years, Stella May Swartz students have earned Pride Slips for following our expectations: be safe, respectful, and responsible. This year, we are using them to promote community and teamwork. Students continue to earn pride slips for demonstrating our expectations. Each student's slips are collected daily and added to the grade level's total. Each grade level is working toward a gradewide incentive. The current incentive is crazy hair day. The purpose of the slips is to encourage expected behavior, which is a recommended practice of Positive Behavioral Intervention Supports (PBIS). 


MEET MRS. ROSS
