Title 1 funds are used to provide Reading interventionists for each elementary building in the Riverview School District. Title 1 funds are used to provide a reading interventionist teacher for the junior high and high school building to provide interventions for students who are not on grade level in reading. Title 1 funds are used to purchase "Leader in Me" curriculum to address student social emotional learning. ESA funds/Title 1 funds were used for purchasing 95% group phonics programs for K-3 grades. Professional development funds were used to purchase professional development for teachers K-3 grades in 95% phonics. ESSR funds were used to purchase Edmentum for grades 7-12 which will include exact path to use during SOAR time each week to address student academic needs. |
