



LITERARY DEVICES

Tell me again, what are **LITERARY DEVICES**?

<u>Literary Devices</u> are the structures authors use in their writing to convey their message and make the story more enjoyable.

There are MANY different types of Literary Devices. I am going to share a few commonly discussed at school.

Alliteration - Quickly repeating a consonant sound or vowel group.

Ex. - Peter Piper picked a peck of pickled peppers.

<u>Foreshadowing</u> – Giving hints early in the story, about something that will happen later in the story, without spoiling the ending.

Hyperbole - Using words that exaggerate in order to make a larger-then-life effect.

Ex. I'm so hungry I could eat a horse!

Imagery (Visualizing) - Using words or phrases to create a "picture" in your mind.

Ex. The giant tree was ablaze with the orange, red, and yellow leaves that were beginning to make their decent to the ground.

Metaphor - Implying that one subject (thing) is another.

Ex. Andy was a lion on the football field.

Onomatopoeia - A word that makes the sound it's suppose to depict.

Ex. Boom, zap, buzz, crash.

Personification – Giving human traits to inanimate objects or animals.

Ex. The sun smiled down on that warm summer day.

<u>Plot</u> – The sequence of events and happenings that make up the story.

<u>Point of View</u> – The manner in which the story is narrated. It's the 'who' is telling the story. The two main points-of-view often seen in children's literature are:

First Person - Meaning a character in the story is telling the story.

It looks like: "I went to the store with my Mom." or "I helped her carry the groceries to the car."

Third Person - Meaning a narrator is telling the story.

It looks like: "Billy went to the story with his mom." or "He helped his mom carry groceries to the car."

Setting - The time, place, or mood of the story.

Simile - Comparing two unrelated things using 'like' or 'as'.

Ex. Her room looked like a tornado had just gone through it. Her eyes sparkled as bright as the sun.

In math, we have learned about the penny and dime. Dump out some change and ask your child to sort the coins and identify them.




