1. Technology Incubator Project Update

Ms. Jo-Ann Sexton gave an update on the Technology Incubator Project. She reviewed the history and process of how these internal grants work. Each person awarded a grant agrees to participate in professional development during the first year of the award and then to become a technology mentor to their colleagues in the following years.

Tech Incubator Awardees, Ms. Amato, Mrs. Cleere, and Ms. DiTondo gave presentations about technology in their classrooms. They stated technology has given them the ability to record lessons for students to review or watch if needed. They stated the technology has helped students reach broad spectrums of learning including personally designed teacher interaction, educational virtual reality trips and the ability to learn computer programs that will assist them in their school career. They provided detailed descriptions of classroom activities and learning through technology.

Ms. Sexton stated the technology Incubator workshops were helpful to connect with other teachers who have had successful experiences.

Ms. Sexton reviewed information regarding technology in Math, and Special Education provided by Mr. Gene Jordan, Mrs. Mary DeMann, Ms. Samantha Driscoll and Mrs. Amanda Burns.

Mrs. Champney stated it was nice to see technology used in so many ways.

Mrs. Widdall stated kudos to Whitney Point for not putting their teachers into a cookie cutter mold.

2. CEA Strategic Plan

Mrs. Jo-Anne Knapp gave a presentation on the CEA Strategic Plan. She outlined the efforts the building has been working on to improve overall school performance. She reviewed CEA benchmark data and noted that 50% of students at the CEA their individual growth targets and that 42% of grade 3 students met proficiency on the NYS Assessments which was a significant increase from the year before. She noted that the school made a big effort to make participation in the NYS assessment a positive celebratory experience. She thinks this has reduced stress. Mr. Tasber noted the importance of the shift in attitude toward assessments. Mrs. Widdall added that she appreciated the effort toward creating a positive environment.
