#### J. COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Anthony Burchell asked what could be done to have a turf field considered in the upcoming Capital Project. He stated a Petition has been signed by over 140 people in favor of the field.

Sara Benscoter stated she welcomes the petition. She explained a turf field is part of the district's plan, but just not this time.

Robert Dunham stated the public has been told that in the past.

Anthony Burchell stated they are not asking that the current project plans be thrown out, just to put off what we have on there now to a later date. He stated other schools have been able to add a turf field with a small impact on the taxes. He stated every year the administration comes to the public for money. Mr. Burchell stated it is not very often that the public asks for something

in return. He asked why the bus loop was not addressed before the money was spent to upgrade the fields behind the CEA.

Robert Dunham stated the bus loop has been there for 40 years with no incidents. He stated there are people outside of the sports community that are not happy about the removal of the grass area for the parking lot and bus loop. He asked why the District needs to redo the bus loop, and if the turf field is not being put in, will the District be providing for a way to maintain the current fields? He stated there have been athletes injured due to poor field quality.

Ms. Follette explained that decisions are made based on a 5-year plan that studies the overall conditions of the district. The black top needs to be repaired and for the repairs to be aided, it will need to be done at the level the State requires. There is also a safety issue due to vehicle, bus and pedestrian traffic coming together throughout the campus. The new design meets State guidelines by providing a separate bus loop, designated student drop-off areas, and a separation of vehicle traffic. She stated parking is also limited at the High School/CEA campus and this creates problems at many events, especially for many elderly community members. She stated there are repairs that need to be done throughout the buildings, including roof and electrical work and if the Capital Project is voted down, it will leave the school in a vulnerable position. The district would have to pay for these repairs through the operating budget.

Thomas Tasber stated if the project is voted down, the turf field will be pushed further out due to the way that the State allocates aid and the reset dates for aid.

Gene Jordan stated if the choice is between safety in the parking lot or a turf field, safety will come first.

Ms. Follette stated she would be happy to meet with them if they would like to discuss this further.

A discussion ensued regarding historical project work and the scope of the parking lot work to be done.

Dan Thorp announced the Eagles Nest is 501(c)(3) non for profit organization as of a week ago.

Thomas Tasber discussed a mailing received by the Board of Education.
