Old Business

a. Phase II Update

Mrs. Hibbard and Mrs. Lindsley presented an update on Phase II Renovation work. Work in the TRA auditorium continues. The painting is nearly completed and new seats should arrive later in April. Contractors will begin closing in the hallway ceilings starting on the second floor next week.

b. Budget Development Update

Mrs. Hibbard presented updated budget information. The approved state budget yielded an additional \$191,283 in aid over the governor's proposed budget. Mrs. Hibbard recommends that the additional aid be used to reduce the amount of money needed from reserves for the 2012-2013 budget. Mrs. Hibbard reviewed the Financial Planning Committee's budget survey results. Mrs. Hibbard shared the reductions necessary to arrive at \$31,041,874 budget resulting in a 1.97% levy increase and a \$30,896,207 contingent budget.

Mrs. Nancy Freeh again expressed her concerns over the District losing a French teaching position. She re-read parts of a letter she presented to Board of Education at a previous meeting.

Mrs. Paula Kupiec stated Deposit is the only school in Broome County that offers only one language this year.

Mrs. Stacy Marye expressed her support of the continuation of French. She explained how taking French helped her daughter throughout school and compliments her current college study in economics.

Ms. Emily Snyder stated she felt sports should be cut before academic classes. She felt students come to school to learn and they can play sports outside of school.

Mrs. Sandra Edwards stated it would dishearten her to see Whitney Point Central School District students not have the same choices available to students in other districts.

Mrs. Sara Benscoter thanked all who spoke.

Mrs. Mary Ellerson stated she would like to have a procedure in place to have the portable score board available for use at home games.

Mr. Terry Dean stated this could be done and would need to be organized through the athletic department, perhaps incorporated through the request for facility use.

New Business

a. Solar Energy Update

Mr. Terry Dean presented information regarding the District's photovoltaic panels. He stated the Whitney Point Central School District has realized an energy savings of about one million dollars to date since the Energy Management Program was started in 2004. He discussed what is currently happening with the solar power in the school buildings. The District has a total of 489 solar panels between the three schools. He explained that if our solar system is producing more electricity than we can use, the system will feed power back in to the electrical grid and will be credited to the District's account.

Mr. Dean stated the three solar panel systems cost \$587,000. The District's favorable building aide ratio and a NYSERDA grant made the installation of the panels very affordable. Only \$8,000 of local tax dollars were used toward the solar project. The panels paid for themselves in two semesters.

Mr. Anthony Burchell asked what would happen if the grids were covered by snow?

Mr. Dean explained the panels are angled and black, so the snow does not stay on them long.

Mrs. Kathleen Driscoll asked how you determine when they need to be replaced?

Mr. Dean stated the panels are expected to last 20-25 years. We will need to keep track of the amount of electricity they are producing to determine when they will need to be replaced.

A discussion ensued.

b. Transfer of Position

Mrs. Hibbard recommended that in accordance with Civil Service Law §70, the function of School Business Executive be transferred to Broome Tioga BOCES beginning May 15, 2012.

Mrs. Sara Benscoter commented on Mrs. Lindsley's humbleness and willingness to work with others.

Mrs. Lindsley stated the business office staff has taken on extra duties with changing mandates and she appreciates their willingness to accept the challenge of increasing reporting and auditing requirements.
