



In order to hunt solo, persons under 16 must take and pass this course to obtain a hunting license and also have a valid FOID card. Course topics include first aid, field safety, hunter responsibility, wildlife conservation & identification, basic archery & muzzle loading, wildlife management, firearms & ammunition, and state regulations. NOTE: Participants must attend both days to pass the class. No personal guns allowed!


#### The following ordinances are enforced by the Charleston Police Department
