1: Jointly Developed Expectations and Objectives

Atkins High School will do the following:

- Include a group of stakeholders that are representative of our school population and all families including Title I families in biannual meetings to be held in the Fall and Spring Semester of each year to aid in the development, modification, and assessment of progress of our Family and Community Engagement plan at the high school level.
- Utilize several means of communication to allow for parental involvement in a variety of ways to allow all families the opportunity to participate.
- Apply knowledge gathered from the committee to better shape family and community involvement and make edits and changes as needed.
- Continue Parent Survey that will determine the parents that are able to volunteer for activities during the school year and in what capacity. The completed surveys will be saved as a digital file that will be shared with teachers to utilize.

2. Communications

Communication will be provided in various ways to assure all stakeholders are informed. The AHS Parent and Family Engagement Plan will be posted on the school website under the state required information link.

Parent/family Contact: Teachers will keep the family informed of their child's performance on a continuing basis. At the beginning of the year, teachers will inform all parents of possible ways that they can communicate with the school usually indicated in individual newsletters or syllabi.

- **Progress reports and report cards** are sent home regularly throughout the year to inform parents of their child's academic performance.
- Parent Conferences are held in October and February to discuss your child's strengths, weaknesses, and areas where you can help your child reach their full potential.
- **Telephone calls** are generally used on an as needed basis and will be used to communicate behavior, concerns, or praises.

3. Building Capacity of School Staff

Parental involvement is vital to every child's education. AHS teachers will receive 2 hours of parental involvement training every four years in accordance with DESE. AHS staff recognize the importance of working and communicating with parents. Teachers are encouraged to be active partners with parents by communicating through emails, phone calls, sending positive postcards through mail, eSchool, Remind, and conferences. Events, such as Football 101 and Open House, provide the perfect opportunities to meet parents and let them know how much we value their involvement.

Atkins High School has scheduled two parent/teacher conferences. Teachers communicate with parents of students that have a failing grade. Teachers will also contact parents on an as needed basis for other issues, concerns, or for praise.

The school's process for resolving parent concerns is included in the school handbook. Our school counselor will also be available as a resource to teachers during the year and at parent teacher conferences.

The high school counselor and advisory teachers provide resources to use with all students and/or parents with a focus on Character Education, Behavior Management, Conflict Resolution, Personal/Social issues, course selection, career planning, and preparation for post-secondary opportunities

The Atkins community is vital to the success of our school. Band booster committees help in school activities. A school resource officer is on campus to act as a liaison for our students and parents for resources in the community to best assist and serve them.

AHS library media specialist and Atkins Public Library will work together to strengthen the school's library and literacy.

The High School will help transition 8th grade students to the 9th grade by having 8th graders tour the high school and meet the teachers.

The High school counselor will meet with students to help schedule classes for the following year.

The High School will host an ice cream social to inform students and parents about the benefits of concurrent credits and UACCM.
