# **SCHOOL UPDATES:**

# **School Functioning Updates and Priorities:**

- School year- social, emotional, mental health needs are front and center this year- some students, this is their first full year of full in person education- we swapped times so our schools are adjusting to that- high school has created an entire new schedule- we are down staffed/ biggest gap is in para educator positions and we have a few other gaps
- Counseling department has struggled with staff out for various reasons- we have been at about half staff for most of this year so far- team is working really well to support each other and work together
- A lot of covering for each other
- behavioral issues are frequent as are mental health crisis (suicide), disclosures about abuse that is ongoing and also happened during covid and is now being revealed- a lot of DCYF referrals
- Barb has worked with Tara to get out some suicide prevention materials and resources for the community
- covid cases are daunting as well and add extra stress- especially at middle and high school
- some parents are choosing to keep their children home as cases increase and/or because they do not wish for their children to wear masks
- Craig asked about how students were receiving their education while home- Barb stated that it's individualized based on grade levels and schools
- Samantha gave an update from Winnisquam- mental health is at forefront- assistant
  principal has already done multiple bullying investigations- tolerance is an issue school
  wide- Winnisquam Edit/ an Instagram page where they are posting slandering, nasty
  posts about students and staff- social media is a challenge- Gruller- social emotional
  curriculum rolling out to middle and high students but some are resisting- covid cases

- are a struggle as well as staff absences- there are some positives: Homecoming, Bear Ambassadors- hiring a new Business Teacher- looking for a biology teacher
- We have a nice space for outside supports to come in and use- we are calling it student support area- furniture is coming! If there are resources that should go into that space-let Barb know!

# **Grants Updates:**

- **Promising Futures Grant**: just learned we got that from NH DOE- \$38,000- intention is to do Tier I implementation and MTSB- will do curriculum and training for staff- One Trusted Adult workshops- mostly PD and student support- wrote in bringing a trainer to provide the Peer Leadership on Suicide prevention
- **Portrait of the Graduate:** Big picture thinking at this time- next week we are having student design sessions with a facilitator coming in- centering around how the Portrait applies and how they would like to see the school move forward- October 27 there is a dinner to offer discussion on POG and overview of the Portrait
- **STOP Grant** Department of Justice- work day is November 9- training day on Threat Assessment Teams
- **SAP:** Barb needs to talk with Kandyce- Jamie is our SAP and is now counselor extraordinaire

# Kristen McGraw, UpReach Therapeutic Equestrian Center

- Wrapping up programming on October 27
- will have had 7-3 week sessions- served 16 kids
- after school program was not hugely attended- had about 9- 10 kids
- in November they will begin planning for spring to reopen in early May and run through October- if anyone would like to talk about putting together a group, talk to Kristen
- During the winter- people can go to Goffstown and work with the horses inside

# **Barb Slayton**, Franklin Office of School Wellness

- October 5- 80- 100 participants watched film *Tre Maison Dason* and stayed for panel discussion.
- Fantastic event with a lot of positive energy
- Carol said it was life changing for her
- Kandyce said the kid's room was great- they were very well behaved- the panel discussion itself was amazing- was amazed by the number of people

## Early Childhood Coalition through Greater Tilton/Franklin Area Resource Centers

- Barb is leading workgroup help meet basic needs of struggling families- if anyone is interested let Barb know- focus is on early childhood- looking for ways to publicize the resources or find new ways to get those to people- first meeting is next week on zoom-
- Sarah Fox is on a workgroup focusing on the transition between preschool to kindergarten to build a program with family support

#### Eva Thurston, Early Head Start, Home Based Services Coordinator- Franklin, Laconia

- still looking for teachers- about 12
- had an event planned for people to see the facility but no one signed up
- some classrooms are closed due to short staffing and some are combined
- almost fully enrolled

- DCYF reporting is down but that does not mean that it is not happening during covid
- now reporting is up and they are seeing more than they have before
- totally back to doing everything in person and seeing kids in person and in schools- will be asking to do more of that in schools

- the help on the CMT team helped her connect to 3-4 other places
- really appreciates the support from this team

 everything is public knowledge- but the money coming into the county- they are having weekly, and monthly meetings on how to spend that money- looking at global populations and housing Put an RFQ out to see who does the servicing and how to make it happen- an RFP will
