SCHOOL UPDATES:

School Functioning Updates and Priorities:

 Doing a showing with various local organizations: Tre Maison Dason October 5 at Smitty's adults in one room, two theaters for kids who can sit and watch... panel discussion facilitated by Laura Knoy...including impacted youth

- FHS: Down a guidance counselor at high school but new one starting at end of October, FMS is down one counselor and one on leave. We should be fully staffed by November.
- Observing that pandemic has affected an uptick of mental health referrals and DCYF referrals.
- Had a few Covid cases across FSD, masking-up when there is a case in class at PSS or FMS, High School everyone masks up if there is a case IF 3 feet cannot be maintained.
 We will let folks know when they arrive if masks are required.
- A lot of professional work with teachers over the summer focused on alignment of curriculum through the grade levels and developing better understanding of competency based learning.
- Provider Room: FSD has a provider room if you need a space to meet with students.
 Check in with Tracy Tucker the school administrative assistant

Grants Updates:

- Promising Futures Grant: RE application required, will find out at the start of October... will be about \$50,000 for staff PD and Wellness Activities and Family Outreach
- Portrait of the Graduate... awarded \$250,000 from Barr Foundation to bring the Portrait into Practice
- STOP Grant
 - We have our allocation of money now!
 - Bolstering Behavioral Intervention Teams
 - Core Team training in November
 - Trying to build some redundancy on the team

 Fun at the Farm group on Wednesday afternoons... 8-14 years old, hour long session with life skills... four slots available...

- Resilience Range (psycho-education curriculum facilitated by Kristen and a social
 worker, different topics each week...communication, perspective, self-worth, do
 activities with ponies and reinforce those skills, parents attend Care Cafe with a
 facilitator... parents discuss and the join their kids with the ponies, family activity and
 then celebration. They run Resilience Range in Goffstown all year round so when
 Boscawen ends, you can still get to attend... There are no geographic restrictions.
- Long Term Goal: Permanent Property at the Boscawen Property, but need to show programming and need to get more folks involved and some story telling
- There are participants from Franklin... we can provide services in Merrimack County free of charge because of funding
