

Greetings UAS Parents, Families, and Community Members,

We have completed the first quarter of the 2021-2022 school year successfully and are looking forward to continuing this success throughout the remainder of the school year. As we enter the winter season, I'd like to provide you with a couple of updates.

#### **COVID**

Our goal entering this school year was to operate an in-person learning plan as close to a traditional school year as possible. Up to this point, we have been operating a normal school schedule in both our high school and elementary schools with very little disruption. The ongoing pandemic has led us to implement some basic mitigation measures to ensure that we can continue to operate our learning plan and keep our students in school. Recent COVID-19 case numbers have been very high in Minnesota and in our Region, however, the county case rates among school-aged children has declined. We have been fortunate to not have a high rate of transmission within our school community, however, we must continue to be vigilant in preventing infections and transmissions of cases. With the increase in vaccination rates, and the recent expansion of vaccines to children ages 5-11, we anticipate that we will be able to continue operating in-person with a normal school schedule for the remainder of the school year. As we enter the cold/ flu season, we are reminding students, parents, and families to continue to screen for symptoms of COVID and/or respiratory illness at home and keep students home if they are exhibiting any symptoms. Students with a fever, difficulty breathing, loss of taste or smell, cough, runny nose, or other COVID-related symptoms should stay at home and not attend school until a diagnosis is obtained. Keeping students who are sick, and/or showing symptoms, at home will help us keep case rates low in our school community. We have at-home COVID test kits available for students and families who would like to take advantage of COVID testing at home. These tests are free of charge and are very easy to use. Notify the district office at 320-573-2174 if you would like a test kit or more information on testing. Keeping case rates low will enable us to continue our in-person learning plan and help us avoid implementing more restrictive mitigation measures. We all want to avoid returning to the restrictive mitigation measures (hybrid/ distance learning, face coverings, restricted quarantine periods, etc.) that we were forced to implement during the 2020-2021 school year. Working together, we can be confident that we will be able to continue with our current learning plan.

### Winter Weather Notifications

One constant of every school year is the impact that the weather can have on school schedules and activities. The winter months always bring the possibility of school closures and delays. The decision to close, or start late, begins at the moment there is a predicted storm or prior to 5:00 am on the morning of the storm. I begin gathering

information about the weather and road conditions from various sources, such as the Minnesota Department of Transportation, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), area Superintendents, as well as consulting with our lead custodian and some of our transportation staff. I also will get out and drive the roads myself to gauge the conditions.

Even with all this information, the decision to close or delay is still a very difficult one to make and I am certain there will be times when others will disagree with my decision. I cannot guarantee that I will make the correct decision every time, but I will guarantee that the decision to close or delay school will be made with the safety of our students and staff as my primary concern. I will also make every effort to make the decision to close or delay in a timely fashion that will minimize any disruptions to the schedules of our families. Depending on the snowfall and/or current weather conditions, and how soon plows may be on the roads, *I will attempt to make this decision by 5:45 am at the latest*.

The decision to close or delay is not always an easy one to make, but through careful analysis of various sources of information, we will make our decision as quickly as possible in order to communicate with everyone as early as we can. Once a decision has been made to close, start late, or close early; communicating this decision to parents and staff is critical. Upsala Area Schools uses a variety of media to disseminate these decisions, including the use of automated phone calls, social media and news outlets. We will communicate through our student management system (JMC) that allows us to send automated calls and emails to parents and students. Parents, please make sure that you have updated your primary contact **information with the district office.** We will also post the message on the district web page and other social media. In addition, we will post announcements on the following news media outlets: WYRQ, KLTF, and KFML Radio - Little Falls; WCCO & WCCO Radio 830 - Minneapolis; KASM Radio - Albany; KCLD, KZPK, and KCML - St. Cloud; KSTP & KSAX - Alexandria; KMSP Fox 9; KEYL Radio - Long Prairie; SC Times Website; and KARE 11. When we communicate the decision to close, start late, or close early; we will attempt to include all the details for parents, students, and staff. Please understand that the media outlets may not include all the details when they distribute the announcement. In the event that we close school for the day, or if we close early, due to severe weather, all extra-curricular and after school activities will also be cancelled or postponed. I also want to encourage all families to make sure that you have a plan in place in case of school closure or delay. Careful planning and communication will ensure that all of our students and staff members are safe during any winter storm weather.

A special thank you to the Upsala Community Center and Lange Oil for supplying the meals for the competitors and volunteers and also to the Upsala Lions for their help in distributing the meals. Congratulations to the members of the Upsala Robotics team on finishing in third place on both days!

Robotics

Upsala Area Schools was host to the Northern Minnesota Robotics Conference Championship on Friday October 29th and Saturday October 30th. FIRST Robotics Competition is considered the High School Varsity Sport of the Mind. Teams are introduced to a problem in early January, and have approximately 8 weeks to design, plan, and build a working robot for competition.

Over the two days of our event, Upsala brought over 1200 people in attendance to participate and watch the Robotics event. We saw schools from all around Minnesota including Swanville, Little Falls, Pillager, Becker, Alexandria, BBE, Pequot Lakes, Pine-River Backus, Cass-Lake Bena, Thief River Falls, Babbitt, Menahga, Frazee Vergas, Big Fork, Bemidji, Nevis, Kelliher, and one North Dakota team from Northwood Hatton. Volunteers including Upsala Alumni, graciously provided their time to come out and assist making the event a success. The event was a great time to share what FIRST Robotics is and how it provides such a strong impact on the futures of our students! The Entirety of the event was sponsored by Sourcewell, Digi-Key, Enbridge, Team Industries, and the Northern Minnesota Robotics Conference.

Upsala's Team 4480 - UC-Botics took home an amazing Third Place finish on Friday. Friday three of our students, Hunter Steuck, Anders Aleckson, and Carter Gudvangen were interviewed by some judges for the Chairman's Award. The Chairman's Award is considered one of the most prestigious awards possible in FIRST Robotics. The trio impressed the Judges with the details of UC-Botics and were able to answer questions on how our robotics program impacts students, provides career opportunities, helps find places for students who are interested in STEM Fields, and also promotes an Inclusive environment to all students. At the conclusion of Friday's event, the Judge's Honored UC-Botics with the JV - Chairman's Award.

On Saturday all team members that wanted an opportunity to drive the robot got it! Throughout the entirety of Saturday, we had all of our rookies take the wheel of the robot, and give it their best effort. Overall, we were successful enough to move upwards into finals, and also take home another Third Place finish.

The Northern Minnesota Robotics Conference Event was a great success overall in the town of Upsala. We saw a lot of new faces, experienced the joy of Robotics, and brought something new unlike any other sporting event normally seen in Upsala. UC-Botics will be gearing up for their next Regional Competition event starting in January once again, where they will be traveling to Grand Forks, ND to the Alerus Center.


Walk-A-Thon raised a record \$4795 for Upsala Dollars for Scholars! Our top five fundraisers were:

The results/Interpretation will be given to students several weeks after testing has been completed. It will include a one hour hands on computer presentation from the National Guard of Camp Ripley.

The ASVAB Career Exploration Program can help you take steps toward finding a career that's right for you. The ASVAB is a multiple-aptitude battery that measures developed abilities and helps predict future academic and occupational success in the military.

### **ACT with Writing**

The ACT with writing is a national assessment that provides information to students, their families, and the district regarding the level of preparedness for postsecondary success. The assessment is given on paper and must be administered on an assigned test date.



Minnesota schools are required to offer students in grades 11 and/or 12 the option to take the ACT with Writing assessment during the school day.

The required Pre-Test Information sessions will also take place during school days. These sessions are required in order to participate in testing on March 8th.
