UPSALA AWARDED STEM GRANT



At halftime of the USA vs Royalton football game Upsala Area Schools was presented a grant of \$25,000 from Farmers Grow Rural Education Program sponsored by the Bayer Fund. Upsala was one of 142 schools across the United States to receive a grant.

The program works to better prepare students for agriculture related fields of STEM (science, technology, engineering and math).

The grant Upsala School District received was used to purchase a water jet. It is similar to a plasma cutter, but the difference is rather than using a lot of electricity and heat it uses water. It has a very fine sand particle that is put through a high pressure system that shoots down and erodes glass or metal.

Changes have been made to the curriculum and students will use the water jet to create a variety of projects and gain highly-marketable skills.

Pictured are Bayer representative Spencer Richardson, agriculture teacher Gretchen Schleper, and technology teacher/coordinator Curtis Robertson. Schleper and Robertson are very thankful to the farmers who nominated the school district. Without their nomination the grant would not have been possible.

As I am writing this article, I am looking out my office windows at a cool, crisp, sunny November afternoon. Even though we have been experiencing an early cold snap, I find it hard to imagine that our Minnesota winter weather is right around the corner and it won't be long until we see subzero temps and

snowstorms.

Each year, one of the most common questions I am asked is how we make decisions to have late starts or closings due to inclement weather. While this is not always an easy decision to make, I want to assure you that the safety of our students and staff is our first concern when deciding to delay or close school for the day. The Upsala Area School District develops a plan that we follow when making weather related decisions. Our plan relies on basic principles of safety which includes the steps we will take to make our decision, how we will communicate our decision with our stakeholders, and how we will connect with other school districts in the region. The purpose of this article is to communicate our plan with our families and community members.

The decision to close, or start late, begins at the moment there is a predicted storm or prior to 5:00 am on the morning of the storm. I begin gathering information about the weather and road conditions from various sources, such as the Minnesota Department of Transportation, Morrison County Public Works, National Weather Service (NWS) for our region, and area Superintendents, as well as consulting with our custodians and transportation staff. I also will get out and drive the roads myself to gauge the conditions.

Even with all this information, the decision to close or delay is still a very difficult one to make and I am certain there will be times when others will disagree with my decision. I cannot guarantee that I will make the correct decision every time, but I will guarantee that the decision to close or delay school will be in the interests of the safety of our students and staff. I will also make every effort to do so in a timely fashion that will minimize any disruptions

to the schedules of our families. Depending on the snowfall and current conditions, and how soon plows may be on the roads, I will attempt to make this decision by 5:45 am at the latest.

Once a decision has been made to close, start late, or close early; communicating this decision to parents and staff is critical. Upsala Area Schools will rely on our JMC messaging system to begin pushing out notifications of our decision as soon as possible. The JMC system will send text, email, and voice messages out based on your account preferences. For this reason, it is very important that you check your JMC account to make sure that your contact information is up to date. Please contact the main office if you need assistance with your JMC account. Due to changes to the REMIND system, we will no longer be using REMIND as a District communication tool. We will also post messages on the District website and social media accounts. In addition, we will post announcements on the following news media outlets: WYRQ, KLTF, and KFML Radio - Little Falls; WCCO & WCCO Radio 830 - Minneapolis; KASM Radio - Albany; KCLD, KZPK, and KCML - St. Cloud; KSTP & KSAX - Alexandria; KMSP Fox 9; KEYL Radio - Long Prairie; SC Times Website; and KARE 11. When we communicate the decision to close, start late, or close early; we will attempt to include all the details for parents, students, and staff. Please understand that the media outlets may not include all the details when they distribute the announcement. In the event that we close school for the day, or if we close early, due to severe weather, all extra-curricular and after school activities will also be cancelled or postponed.

In addition, we encourage all families to have their own plan for school closings or delays. Communicate this plan with your children. Being prepared is the best possible way to avoid potential problems in the event that any type of school closing occurs, as this is bound to happen.

Finally, we ask that all community members be more safety conscious at bus stops and when driving near school. Keeping our students safe as they go to and from school is a collective effort and on slippery roads that means slowing down and being aware. 

The Upsala Robotics Team, UC-Botics, took a Venture North to Thief River Falls this year for their annual "Northern Minnesota Robotics Conference" (NMRC) Championship event. This year Mr and Mrs. Robertson took 9 Students from Upsala to compete in a game called "Deep Space". The same game that was played last spring when the team went to Duluth. The Conference event put Upsala up with 18 other schools from NorthWest Minnesota and North Dakota.

UC-Botics made their way into finals as a first round pick for the



#2 Seed Alliance. The Alliance was made up with UC-Botics along with Team 876 - Thunder Robotics From Hatton-Northwood, ND; and Team 3754 - Trek North Robotics From Bemidji, MN. After some difficult matches, the alliance played in the Consolation round match against the First Seeded Team. After a very aggressive and challenging round, UC-Botics and their alliance partners took home an overall 3rd Place Victory and a plaque commemorating the placement.

UC-Botics also received recognition at the NMRC Championship event by earning the "Engineering Inspiration" Award. This award was given for the team's dedication and diligence of sharing the love and joy of STEM and Robotics with other teams around the state, and for being a shining light and beacon for other teams to draw inspiration from.

UC-Botics has participated in the NMRC and the championship event since its inception in 2017. The NMRC is also the first conference in the state of Minnesota Officially recognized by the Minnesota State High School League. The NMRC is now 28 member teams strong and covers over 35,000 square miles. Mr. Robertson currently is listed as the Vice President for the Conference.


Drama Club

We are still waiting for our official section assignment, but the sub-section contest will likely be January 25, with the top plays advancing to the section contest a week later.



Kindergarten Roundup




Upsala Elementary School will hold its annual Kindergarten Round Up on Friday, March 6th.


MEET AUTHOR JASON WALZ
