## Robotics B.E.S.T. Competition

On Saturday, October 30 the Gunter Robotics team traveled to Trenton High School to compete in the B.E.S.T. Robotics competition. B.E.S.T. stands for Boosting Engineering Science \& Technology. This competition happens once a year. Three members of the team went to Kickoff on September 4th where they discovered the challenge. The challenge this year was called DemoDAZE. The robot had to demolish a tower and put the materials in specified areas, put light poles in their bases, and a few other minichallenges within the round.

The team had eight weeks to design, build, and program the robot. The robot had to be built using only materials allowed by the B.E.S.T. Organization. Time proved to be a challenge this year with many of the students actively involved with band and football. The team had to work after school hours and on weekends. Once the robot was complete, the team began their practice driving on the competition field which is built and housed in the Robotics portable.

Another challenging aspect the team faced was the fact that our previous team was made up of seniors who all graduated. All of the members were new and none had taken the Robotics class the previous year. However, the challenge was met head on by this team of newbies! When competition day arrived, everyone on the team showed up. There were 29 teams present at the competition ranging in school classification size. This competition does not make a designation on school size; 2 A schools compete against 6 A schools. We are proud to announce that out of 29 schools, Gunter placed $16^{\text {th }}$. "For not having any returning team members our Gunter team did very well," said Mrs. Foster. She was proud of their effort and performance.
The team would like to thank its volunteer mentors: Marion Cole, Michael Foster, Dennis Reavis, and Mac McDowell. All of our mentors brought very valuable knowledge that they shared with the team.
