## Service-To-Community Project

Beginning with the Class of 1993 (freshman class in the fall of 1988) all students will be asked to take part in a project called "Service to Your Community". This project involves a student "donating" -- "giving of him/herself" volunteering ten (10) hours or more of their time at no pay to help a non-profit organization in the community in which they live. A student has from the time they enter high school until they graduate to complete this project. We encourage students to complete this project during their freshman year, but if they choose they may do it anytime throughout their four years at F.H.S. However, it must be completed prior to graduation from high school.

One of the purposes of this project is to allow students to see the benefits of citizens helping citizens and to feel the good feelings that go along with doing something good for someone without being paid for it. Hopefully, this will encourage and build good citizenship and a lot of good camaraderie between young people and adults within our community. The people in our community do a great deal for our young people and it seems the right thing to do to expect our young people to return some of those good deeds to the people in the communities in which they live.

In Part 1 of the form you and the student will plan the work to be completed. After receiving approval of the project from the Principal, the student will return to complete the job. At that time you will fill out Part 2 confirming that the job was completed satisfactorily. Feel free to comment on the Service Project on Part 2 of the form.

It is our hope that this type of school-community service project will benefit both our students and our community. Perhaps by working together we will build a stronger relationship between our young people and the communities in which they now live and where they may work in the future.
