## Mrs. Wallis - 3-5th Grade Math/Science

Math: In math class this month, we will be focusing on some foundational concepts. We will start with place value, where students will learn to understand the value of each digit in a number. From there, we will move on to comparing whole numbers, helping students develop their skills in understanding greater than, less than, and equal to. Finally, we will explore rounding, a useful skill for estimating and simplifying numbers. We will engage in hands-on activities, group work, and problem-solving tasks to enhance the learning experience.



Science: In science class, 5th grade will be diving into the fascinating world of Earth's Changing Systems and 4th grade will look at Organisms Functioning in their Environment. Additionally, we will investigate how different organisms adapt and interact with their environment. 3rd grade will explore topics such as weather patterns, how they are formed, and their impact on our daily lives. This will involve exciting experiments, observations, and discussions that will surely captivate our young scientists.

#### Bini'ant'aats'ozí- August

During the month of August the crops begin to ripen and it is time to harvest the early crops. The Navajos named August, Biniant'aats'ozi meaning Ripening of Early Crops. This means that some of the crops are now ready for harvesting. Parents are very watchful of their children who are helping with the harvest that they don't pick the green crops, which will be picked later when they are ripe.

The harvested crops are shared among immediate family members and clan families. Many traditional corn recipes are cooked and eaten at this time. They include underground steamed ears of corn, fresh commeal baked in cornhusks called kneel down bread, open fire roasted corn, corn steve, and other delicious ways of cooking corn.
