Welcome to a meeting of Prosser School District Board of Directors!

Your views and interest in education are important to us and to your schools. Whether your visit is for the purpose of bringing information to the board's attention, solving a problem, or simply to see what's going on, we hope you'll feel welcome and comfortable at this meeting. We also hope that you will leave with a better understanding of your school district and its board of directors.

How the Board Operates

As the board meeting progresses, you may notice that there is quick action on some items. This is because the board generally considers an issue for several meetings before taking action, and also because background materials on the various items are sent to members for their careful study prior to the meeting. Sometimes the board will approve a motion that encompasses many items. These items, grouped under the "consent" portion of the agenda, are considered routine. You'll be able to follow the action more carefully if you pick up a copy of the agenda that is available.

Board members are: Bill Jenkin, President; Dr. Warren Barmore, Vice-President; Peggy Douglas, Scotty Hunt, Legislative representative and Andy Howe, WIAA representative. Student representatives are Lacey Desserault, Ali Cox and Liz Bender.

About Board Meetings

Business meetings are held twice each month, usually on the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays. The first meeting of the month is also a time for the various educational programs of the district to provide an educational presentation to the Board. These meetings begin at 7:00 p.m.

The board encourages input on all issues under discussion at the business meetings.

About Executive Sessions

The board may occasionally go into executive session, thus excluding the public and the news media from witnessing the discussion. You should know though, that the board will only discuss issues in executive session. It must, by law, take all actions in an open meeting. The law also limits what the board can legally discuss in executive session. These closed discussions may only concern litigation, personnel selection or evaluation, negotiations, complaints against an officer or staff member or real estate transactions where public disclosure would be damaging to individuals or the general welfare of the district. Before going into executive session, the board president must estimate the time the board will return to open session.

Study Sessions

Board Study Sessions are held by the board to address specific issues and to give the board an opportunity to have staff make presentations regarding specific areas of instruction or operation. Study sessions are open meetings and offer the community an opportunity to hear the issues being discussed. Study sessions follow the same protocols as regular board meetings for addressing the board with questions or concerns.

Addressing the Board

You may present a concern to the board during the time reserved for hearing public comment. If this is the case we ask that you:

- Prior to the start of the meeting, sign in, noting the topic you intend to address to the board.
- Come to the microphone and state your name.
- Do not reflect adversely on the political or economic view, ethnic background, character or motives of any individual.
- Do keep your comments concise, nonemotional and brief.

The board is interested in hearing your concerns and your compliments too. It's best to call the superintendent's office a

couple of days before the meeting. If this isn't possible, you can ask the board president to recognize you during the hearing section.

Board Hearings

The school board can be compared to a "court of last resort." If a concern cannot be solved by first talking with the teacher, principal, or appropriate district personnel, it may be forwarded to the board for hearing. Sometimes this hearing may be conducted in "executive session," meaning the public and the media are not in attendance.

About Your Board

Public schools are especially close to the communities they serve because they are governed by men and women selected from the community. These men and women - your school board; are volunteers who spend a great deal of time on the many details involved in providing quality education.

Board members serve four-year terms. They are required to file financial disclosure statements with the Washington State Public Disclosure Commission and must be registered voters of the school district

School board members attend meetings, keep communications open with other members of the community and represent the needs of the district before local, state and national representatives. They make critical decisions that have a direct impact on what children learn and how they learn it. However, a school board is a legal body and can only make decisions as a body.

You may notice that many of the decisions the board must make are not directly related to instruction. School board members are also responsible for keeping the buildings and grounds in good shape, balancing the budget, protecting the district's legal interests, and providing for long-range planning.

Other Board members present included Andy Howe and Scotty Hunt. Also present were Dr. Ray Tolcacher, Superintendent; Craig Reynolds, Business Manager; Deanna Flores, Assistant Superintendent and Julie Hyatt, Secretary. Student representatives Ali Cox and Lacey Desserault were also in attendance. There was an audience representing school staff and community members. President Bill Jenkin and Peggy Douglas were excused from the meeting.

Dr. Tolcacher reported that tomorrow there will be Gap Training Phase II at 2:20 at PHE. He will provide the Board members with a schedule of the Phase II training.

Healthy Youth Surveys at HMS and PHS are complete. There were very few opt-outs.

We've been working with Keith Merritt, our security consultant on finalizing plans to meet with the city and the hospital to work together on emergency plans.

The school district is partnering with a couple of churches and community groups to put together our Halloween Carnival on Monday. It is our 13th year of participating.

Dr. Tolcacher reported that Bill Jenkin had authorized him to move ahead and schedule a Special Board Meeting with Jon Gores, Jim McNeill and Ed Champagne, so the Board can make a decision on the bond resolution. The meeting will be held at 7:00 p.m. on November 1. After the decision has been made, Mr. McNeill will provide us with the resolution to vote on at the next meeting.

Regarding the sewer and water capacity issues at Whitstran – Dr. Tolcacher should have that answer in a day or two and will get the findings to the Board.

There was discussion to possibly have an action item on the same night as the special board meeting to finalize the resolution.

It was a great program.

Approval of Minutes

Contracts and Personal Service Agreements:

1. <u>Washington Virtual Academies/Insight School of Washington Assessment Agreement:</u> Prosser School District has agreed to provide online students from Washington Virtual Academies/Insight School of Washington access to state assessments here at Prosser School District. The purpose of this Agreement is to provide Online/Nonresident District access to MSP, EOC, SBAC, WA-AIM, and any other state assessments provided by law to its nonresident students. Under this Agreement, the Resident District will provide assessment testing to the Online/Nonresident District's eligible nonresident students.

2. Highly Capable Program Plan Approval:

The state Highly Capable program application requires approval by our Board of Directors. Highly Capable supports a small portion (\$27,913) of our Highly Capable Program aka: OPEN DOOR teachers' salaries. This grant plan is completed electronically and submitted to OSPI upon school board approval. Assurance pages are signed and kept on file at the curriculum office.

Louis Santana - Santana Jams Agreement

Louis Santana of Santana Jams provided DJ services for Homecoming at Prosser High School on October 22, 2016 from 7:00-11:00 pm. DJ services will be paid through the ASB budget.

Motion by Andy Howe, seconded by Scotty Hunt and motion carried to approve the Santana Jams Service Agreement.

Award of 2016/2017 Propane Contract

Craig Reynolds said that on September 26, 2016, letters seeking bids for propane services were sent out to Americas, Ferrell Gas, Bleyhl Farm Service, and All American Propane. We

only received one of the bids back from All American Propane, our current service provider. The 2016/2017 contract maybe renewed upon the same terms and conditions, for an additional one year term up to two (2) additional years.

Motion by Andy Howe, seconded by Scotty Hunt and motion carried to award the propane contract to All American Propane for the 2016/17 school year.

Dr. Tolcacher reported that as a requirement for a school district to apply for state construction funding, a documented survey of available and suitable school facilities in adjacent districts must be completed and verified by the school board. To that end, documentation of those surveys of districts adjacent to Prosser were included in the Board packet. These surveys conclude there is no available space.

Motion by Scotty Hunt, seconded by Andy Howe and motion carried to verify the surveys have been completed by approving Resolution No. 06-16: Adjacent Districts' Survey.

Roll Call: Andy Howe, Aye; Warren Barmore, Aye; Scotty Hunt, Aye.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

Additional School Psychoeducational Testing

Dr. Syndi Duehn reported that like most school districts in the Northwest, it has been difficult to find school psychological services. At the current time our District is short on fulltime school psychologists. To retain the current psychologists' staff and to increase the number of staff needed, we are perusing the use of an ESD 105 and ESD 123 option for school district consideration. This option is called "*PresenceLearning*". This is an online service to complete psychoeducational assessments for special education evaluation which includes attending IEP meetings through the use of the internet. The company charges us by the number of students serviced, not a monthly fee.

The use of online testing is a secure platform that ensures compliance with FERPA and will give our school district additional help as we continue to meet compliance as well as work to find additional onsite, district-employed personnel. A copy of the ESD 105 information packet of services provided by "*PresenceLearning*" was included in the board packet.

Discussion

Scotty Hunt would like to know which other districts use this service for psychological services. He doesn't like this idea, as there isn't a face-to-face meeting, as it is done online, virtually.

Dr. Duehn said the online testing is merely to test their intelligence, their learning potential, where body language isn't as important. She would prefer this method also be used for academic assessments as well, as it "evens the scale" among students, but she will accept the Board's guidance.

Dr. Tolcacher said we can hold off making a decision until the next Board meeting. Maybe we can bring in someone from ESD to discuss this method. More and more things are being done virtually, especially in the areas of shortages of specialists. We need to do all we can to maintain compliance.

Andy Howe asked if paras would have to be trained.

Dr. Duehn said that the PHS SPED paras will be trained in the platform.

Dr. Duehn explained the staff we have to serve the students as well as the fact we have been actively recruiting. We've had 44 referrals so far this school year. We do not have the staff to meet these needs. We have until December to get all of these students evaluated. Syndi also said we can't fill the need through contracting companies.

Dr. Tolcacher would like to move ahead with this, as we can't wait much longer, or there will be consequences for our District.

After further discussion, it was decided to have Dr. Tolcacher get more information and bring it back to the Board.

<u>Next Steps for Facilities Proposal</u> This was addressed earlier in the meeting.

Dr. Tolcacher will confirm our meeting next week with our three consultants.

Also, Dr. Tolcacher and Craig will hold a conference call tomorrow with J. Marie Reisch tomorrow. She knows what district pamphlets should look like which will go out from the District regarding a bond measure. He wants to hire her to write the District brochure.

ADJOURNMENT: The meeting was adjourned at 8:21 p.m.

A Special Meeting of the Board of Directors of Prosser School District was called to order at 7:04 p.m. by Bill Jenkin, President. Other Board members present included Dr. Warren Barmore, Peggy Douglas, Andy Howe and Scotty Hunt. Also present were Dr. Ray Tolcacher, Superintendent; Craig Reynolds, Business Manager; Julie Hyatt, Secretary and an audience representing school staff, media and community members. Student Board Representative Liz Bender was also present. Also in attendance were Ed Champagne, Jim McNeill and Jon Gores. The meeting was held at Keene-Riverview Elementary.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA:

Motion by Andy Howe, seconded by Warren Barmore and motion carried to approve the agenda.

ACTION ITEM:

President Jenkin announced the Board meeting was being recorded.

Long-Range Facilities Plan Decision

Dr. Tolcacher said tonight's meeting is the culmination of a long process we have gone through to reach this point. Dr. Tolcacher then provided a brief review of that process. He also introduced the three guests in attendance who will help the District as we move forward with pursuing a bond election. The guests were Jim McNeill, Bond Counsel; Ed Champagne, Architects West and Jon Gores from DA Davidson, who will help us sell our bonds.

Motion by Andy Howe, seconded by Peggy Douglas and motion carried to renovate and add extra space to all three elementary schools and to build a new high school at a new site behind the baseball diamond. Mr. Jenkin asked for a roll call on the motion, which was unanimous.

Discussion

Andy Howe asked Peggy Douglas about some additional property which she had been made aware of, which could be potentially used by the District in the future.

Peggy said that a community member had asked her and Mr. Hunt to look at property which might make a good future building site. That decision is not tied to our business tonight.

Dr. Tolcacher asked Jon Gores to address the Board about factors which will affect bond rates. Mr. Gores reported that our assessed value has grown, which is good news. The bad news is that interest rates have gone up in the last few weeks. These two factors have lowered our tax rate. He also said we need to decide if our bonds will have a 20-year or 25-year term.

The Board members all agreed that they felt the 20-year term is the preferred length.

Jim McNeill addressed the Board and explained that the issuance of bonds is a 3-step process. The first step is to adopt a resolution, which will contain a sample ballot. Secondly, the voters approve the ballot measure and lastly, the Board sells the bonds to DA Davidson. Mr. McNeill said the resolution will include description of the projects. He will have the resolution finalized to be included in the board packet this Friday. Mr. McNeill then explained briefly the process of what happens after the bond is passed.

When questioned, Jim said it is very important the District continues to function separately

from any bond committee. The PDC (Public Disclosure Commission) has very strict laws governing what a District can do when they have a bond election. After the resolution has been adopted, it is appropriate to have a bond committee form and begin promoting the bond.

Dr. Tolcacher asked Mr. McNeill if the Board could take a separate action with another resolution which would allow them to promote the bond.

Jim explained how a separate resolution provides permission for the Board to be able to speak on the bond. Mr. McNeill will also provide that resolution to be included in the Board packet.

Dr. Tolcacher said he would also like to bring someone aboard to handle communications on the bond from the District's perspective. He also said Mr. McNeill will be reviewing all materials the District creates to ensure they are appropriate.

Mr. McNeill said it would be wise for only two Board members to attend community meetings at one time. He would also not use District resources to communicate with anyone about the bond campaign.

Mr. McNeill suggested it would be a good idea to amend the motion to include the renovation of the historic portion of the current high school for office space, etc. and to include the total amount of the bond, which is \$69.3 million.

Motion amended by Andy Howe, seconded by Peggy Douglas and motion carried to include renovation of the historic portion of the current high school for office space, etc. for a total cost of \$69.3 million.

Mr. McNeill answered several questions from the Board members about how they should conduct themselves going forward in order to meet the strict guidelines from the PDC.

Dr. Tolcacher said he would like to bring J. Marie Reisch aboard to help with communications regarding the bond.

ADJOURNMENT:

The Special Board Meeting was adjourned at 7:34 p.m.

At their Special Board Meeting on November 1, 2016, the Prosser School Board took action to finalize a long-range facilities plan which included a motion (1) directing bond counsel, Foster Pepper PLLC, to prepare a resolution that provides for the submission to the District's voters, at a special election to be held on February 14, 2017, of a proposition authorizing the District to issue \$69,300,000 of general obligation bonds to pay costs to: costs of constructing a new high school on a site owned by the District adjacent to Art Fiker Stadium to replace Prosser High School, renovating and expanding Keene-Riverview, Prosser Heights and Whitstran Elementary Schools, and converting the existing Prosser High School into administrative space; and (2) present such resolution to the Board for consideration at the regular Board meeting on November 8.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board take action by adopting Resolution No. 07-16, which authorizes the submission to the District's voters, at a special election to be held on February 14, 2017, a proposition authorizing the District to issue its general obligation bonds for the purpose of paying costs of the projects identified by the Board.

A RESOLUTION of the Board of Directors of Prosser Consolidated School District No. 116-219, Benton and Klickitat Counties, Washington, providing for the submission to the voters of the District at a special election to be held on February 14, 2017, of a proposition authorizing the District to issue general obligation bonds in the principal amount of no more than \$69,300,000, for the purpose of paying costs of constructing a new high school on a site owned by the District adjacent to Art Fiker Stadium to replace Prosser High School, renovating and expanding Keene-Riverview, Prosser Heights and Whitstran Elementary Schools, and converting the existing Prosser High School into administrative space, the principal of and interest on such bonds to be payable from annual excess property tax levies; designating the Secretary to the Board and bond counsel to receive notice of the ballot title from the Auditor of Benton County, Washington; authorizing a request for a Certificate of Eligibility from the State Treasurer pursuant to chapter 39.98 RCW; designating the Secretary to the Board and/or the District's Business Manager as the District officials authorized to file with the State Treasurer, on behalf of the District, the request for a Certificate of Eligibility; and providing for other matters properly related thereto, all as more particularly set forth herein.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF PROSSER CONSOLIDATED SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 116-219, BENTON AND KLICKITAT COUNTIES, WASHINGTON, as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. <u>Findings and Determinations</u>. The Board of Directors (the "Board") of Prosser Consolidated School District No. 116-219, Benton and Klickitat Counties, Washington (the "District"), takes note of the following facts and hereby makes the following findings and determinations:

(a) Overcrowding (including enrollment demands and State of Washington class size reduction initiatives), educationally outdated infrastructure and classrooms, student safety, the institution of new educational programs, and the need to provide space for administrative services require the District to: construct a new high school on a site owned by the District adjacent to Art Fiker Stadium to replace Prosser High School; renovate and expand Keene-Riverview, Prosser Heights and Whitstran Elementary Schools; and convert the existing Prosser High School into administrative space, all as more particularly defined and described in Section 2 herein (collectively, the "Projects").

(b) The District lacks sufficient money with which to pay costs of the Projects.

(c) To pay costs of the Projects, it is necessary and advisable that the District issue and sell unlimited tax general obligation bonds in the principal amount of no more than

\$69,300,000 (the "Bonds"), or such lesser maximum amount as may be legally issued under the laws governing the limitation of indebtedness or required to carry out and accomplish the Projects.

(d) The District is authorized pursuant to Article VII, Section 2(b) of the Washington Constitution and laws of the State of Washington, including Revised Code of Washington ("RCW") 28A.530.010, RCW 28A.530.020, RCW 39.36.050 and RCW 84.52.056, to submit to the District's voters at a special election, for their approval or rejection, the proposition of whether the District shall issue the Bonds to pay costs of the Projects and levy annual excess property taxes to pay and retire the Bonds.

(e) The best interests of the District's students and other inhabitants require the District to carry out and accomplish the Projects as hereinafter provided.

<u>Section 2</u>. <u>Description of the Projects</u>. The Projects to be paid for with proceeds of the Bonds, including interest earnings thereon ("Bond Proceeds"), are more particularly defined and described as follows:

(a) Construct a new high school on a site owned by the District adjacent to Art Fiker Stadium to replace Prosser High School, all as deemed necessary and advisable by the Board.

(b) Renovate and expand Keene-Riverview Elementary School, all as deemed necessary and advisable by the Board.

(c) Renovate and expand Prosser Heights Elementary School, all as deemed necessary and advisable by the Board.

(d) Renovate and expand Whitstran Elementary School, all as deemed necessary and advisable by the Board.

(e) Convert the existing Prosser High School into administrative space, all as deemed necessary and advisable by the Board.

(f) Acquire, construct and install all necessary furniture, equipment, apparatus, accessories, fixtures and appurtenances in the foregoing, all as deemed necessary and advisable by the Board.

(g) Pay incidental costs incurred in connection with carrying out and accomplishing the Projects described above pursuant to RCW 39.46.070. Such incidental costs shall be deemed part of the Projects and shall include, but not be limited to: (1) costs related to the issuance, sale and delivery of the Bonds; (2) payments for fiscal and legal costs; (3) costs of obtaining ratings and bond insurance; (4) costs of printing, advertising, establishing and funding accounts; (5) payment of interest due on the Bonds for up to six months after completion of construction; (6) necessary and related engineering, architectural, planning, consulting, inspection, permitting and testing costs; (7) administrative and relocation costs; (8) site acquisition and improvement costs; (9) demolition costs; (10) costs related to demolition and/or deconstruction of existing school facilities to recycle, reclaim and repurpose such school facilities and/or building materials; (11) costs of on-site and offsite utilities and road improvements; and (12) costs of other similar activities or purposes, all as deemed necessary and advisable by the Board.

The Projects, or any portion or portions thereof, shall be acquired or made insofar as is practicable with available Bond Proceeds, together with any other money of the District legally available therefor, and in such order of time as shall be deemed necessary and advisable by the Board. Subject to Section 6 of this resolution, the Board shall allocate the Bond Proceeds, together with any other money of the District legally available therefor, between the various parts of the Projects so as to accomplish, as near as may be, all of the Projects. The Board shall determine the exact order, extent and specifications for the Projects. The Projects are to be more fully described in the plans and specifications to be filed with the District.

<u>Section 3.</u> <u>Calling of Election</u>. The Auditor of Benton County, Washington, as *ex officio* Supervisor of Elections (the "Auditor"), and the proper officer of the county to which the District belongs pursuant to chapter 28A.323 RCW, is requested to call and conduct a special election in the District, in the manner provided by law, to be held therein on February 14, 2017, for the purpose of submitting to the District's voters, for their approval or rejection, the proposition of whether the District shall issue the Bonds to pay costs of the Projects and levy annual excess property taxes to pay and retire the Bonds.

If the proposition is approved by the requisite number of voters, the District will be authorized to issue, sell and deliver the Bonds in the manner described in this resolution, spend the Bond Proceeds to pay costs of the Projects, and levy annual excess property taxes to pay and retire the Bonds. The Bond Proceeds shall be used, either with or without additional money now available or hereafter available to the District, for capital purposes only, as permitted by law, which shall not include the replacement of equipment.

<u>Section 4</u>. <u>Authorization to Issue the Bonds</u>. The Bonds authorized may be issued as a single issue, as a part of a combined issue with other authorized bonds, or in more than one series, all as deemed necessary and advisable by the Board and as permitted by law. Further, the Bonds may be issued, as deemed necessary and advisable by the Board, as taxable bonds, tax-exempt bonds and/or any other type of tax credit bonds that are now or in the future may be authorized under applicable state and federal law, including, but not limited to, "build America bonds" or "qualified tax credit bonds" within the meaning of Section 54A(d)(1) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") (generically, "Tax Credit Bonds").

Each series of the Bonds shall be issued as fully registered bonds; shall bear interest payable as permitted by law; shall mature within 21 years from the date of issuance of such series of the Bonds (but may mature at an earlier date or dates as fixed by the Board); shall be paid by annual property tax levies sufficient in amount to pay both principal and interest when due, which annual property tax levies shall be made in excess of regular property tax levies without limitation as to rate or amount but only in amounts sufficient to meet such payments of principal and interest as they come due; and shall be issued and sold in such manner, at such times and in such amounts as shall be required for the purpose for which each series of the Bonds are to be issued, all as deemed necessary and advisable by the Board and as permitted by law. The life of the Projects to be

financed with the Bond Proceeds shall exceed the term of the respective series of Bonds that finance such Projects.

The Board hereby authorizes and directs the Secretary to the Board (the "Secretary") to determine for each series of Bonds whether such series should be sold by negotiated or competitive sale, and with respect to such series of Bonds that are to be sold by competitive sale, to: (a) specify a date and time of sale of such Bonds; (b) give notice of that sale; (c) determine any bid requirements and criteria for determining the award of the bid; (d) provide for the use of an electronic bidding mechanism if the Secretary deems electronic bidding to be beneficial to the District; and (e) specify other matters in his or her determination necessary, appropriate or desirable to carry out the sale of the Bonds. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the amount, date, denominations, interest rates, payment dates, final maturity, redemption rights, price, and other terms and conditions of the Bonds (or parameters with respect thereto) shall be hereafter fixed by one or more resolutions may delegate to a District officer or employee the authority to fix any of the foregoing, all as deemed necessary and advisable by the Board and as permitted by law.

Pending the issuance of any series of the Bonds, the District may issue short-term obligations pursuant to chapter 39.50 RCW (which may be issued as Tax Credit Bonds, if permitted under applicable law) to pay for any portion of the costs of the Projects. Such obligations may be paid or refunded with the Bond Proceeds.

If the District receives voter approval to issue the Bonds in the manner described in this resolution, the Board authorizes and directs the Secretary and/or the District's Business Manager (the "Business Manager") to: (a) review and "deem final" (within the meaning of Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission), if necessary and upon such official's satisfaction, any preliminary official statement prepared in connection with the sale of each series of the Bonds by the District; (b) authorize the "deemed final" preliminary official statement to be distributed prior to the date any underwriter or purchaser bids for, purchases, offers or sells each series of the Bonds; and (c) acknowledge in writing any action taken pursuant to clauses (a) and (b) of this paragraph.

<u>Section 5.</u> <u>Intent to Reimburse</u>. The Board declares that to the extent, prior to the date the Bonds, or other bonds or obligations (which includes the Bonds, or other bonds or obligations, issued as tax-exempt bonds and/or Tax Credit Bonds) are issued to pay costs of the Projects, the District shall make capital expenditures for the Projects from money that is not (and is not reasonably expected to be) reserved, allocated on a long-term basis or otherwise set aside by the District under its existing and reasonably foreseeable budgetary and financial circumstances to pay costs of the Projects, those capital expenditures are intended to be reimbursed out of the Bond Proceeds, or proceeds of other bonds or obligations, issued in an amount not to exceed the principal amount of the Bonds provided by this resolution.

<u>Section 6.</u> <u>Sufficiency of Bond Proceeds</u>. If Bond Proceeds are more than sufficient to carry out and accomplish the Projects (the "Excess Bond Proceeds"), and state or local circumstances require, the District may use the Excess Bond Proceeds to: (a) acquire, construct, install, equip and make other capital improvements to the District's facilities; or (b) retire and/or

defease a portion of the Bonds or other outstanding bonds of the District, all as the Board may determine by resolution, after holding a public hearing thereon pursuant to RCW 28A.530.020. In the event that the Bond Proceeds, together with any other money of the District legally available therefor, are insufficient to carry out and accomplish all of the Projects, the District shall use the Bond Proceeds and other available money for paying the cost of that portion of the Projects that is deemed by the Board most necessary and in the best interest of the District.

<u>Section 7.</u> <u>Use of State Financing Assistance</u>. It is anticipated that the District may receive some money from the State of Washington as state financing assistance under chapter 28A.525 RCW with respect to the Projects (the "State Financing Assistance"). The State Financing Assistance shall be used, when and in such amounts as it may become available, to carry out and accomplish the Projects. If the State Financing Assistance is more than sufficient to carry out and accomplish the Projects (the "Excess State Financing Assistance"), and state or local circumstances require, the District may use the Excess State Financing Assistance to: (a) acquire, construct, install, equip and make other capital improvements to the District's facilities; (b) retire and/or defease a portion of the Bonds or other outstanding bonds of the District; or (c) provide for other purposes, all as the Board may determine by resolution, after holding a public hearing thereon pursuant to RCW 28A.530.020.

<u>Section 8.</u> <u>Alteration of Expenditures</u>. If the Board shall subsequently determine that state or local circumstances, including, but not limited to, changed conditions or needs, regulatory considerations or incompatible development, should cause any alteration to the Projects, the District shall not be required to accomplish the Projects and may apply the Bond Proceeds and/or State Financing Assistance (or any portion thereof) to: (a) other portions of the Projects; (b) acquire, construct, install, equip and make other capital improvements to the District's facilities; or (c) retire and/or defease a portion of the Bonds or other outstanding bonds of the District, all as the Board may determine by resolution after holding a public hearing thereon pursuant to RCW 28A.530.020.

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<u>Section 9.</u> Form of Ballot Title. Pursuant to RCW 29A.36.071, the Benton County Prosecuting Attorney, as the county prosecuting attorney of the county within which the majority area of the District is located, is requested to prepare the concise description of the aforesaid proposition for the ballot title in substantially the following form:

<u>Section 10</u>. <u>Authorization to Deliver Resolution to Auditor and Perform Other</u> <u>Necessary Duties</u>. The Secretary or his designee is directed to: (a) present a certified copy of this resolution to the Auditor no later than December 16, 2016; and (b) perform such other duties as are necessary or required by law to submit to the District's voters at the aforesaid special election, for their approval or rejection, the proposition of whether the District shall issue the Bonds to pay costs of the Projects and levy annual excess property taxes to pay and retire the Bonds.

<u>Section 11</u>. <u>Notices Relating to Ballot Title</u>. For purposes of receiving notice of the exact language of the ballot title required by RCW 29A.36.080, the Board hereby designates (a) the Secretary (Ray E. Tolcacher), telephone: 509.786.3323; fax: 509.786.2062; email: <u>ray.tolcacher@prosserschools.org</u>; and (b) bond counsel, Foster Pepper PLLC (Jim McNeill), telephone: 509.777.1602; fax 800.533.2284; email: <u>jim.mcneill@foster.com</u>, as the individuals to whom the Auditor shall provide such notice. The Secretary is authorized to approve changes to the ballot title, if any, deemed necessary by the Auditor or the Benton County Prosecuting Attorney.

<u>Section 12</u>. <u>Authorization to Request Participation in Washington State School District</u> <u>Credit Enhancement Program Authorized</u>. The Board hereby finds and determines that, if the District receives voter approval to issue the Bonds in the manner described in this resolution, it will be in the best interests of the District's taxpayers to request the State of Washington's guaranty for payment of the Bonds under chapter 39.98 RCW, the Washington State School District Credit Enhancement Program. Accordingly, the Board hereby requests the State Treasurer to issue a Certificate of Eligibility to the District pledging the full faith, credit, and taxing power of the State of Washington to guarantee the payment, when due, of the principal of and interest on the Bonds pursuant to chapter 39.98 RCW and the rules promulgated thereunder by the State Finance Committee. The Board designates the Secretary and/or the Business Manager as the District officials authorized to file with the State Treasurer, on behalf of the District, the request for a Certificate of Eligibility.

<u>Section 13.</u> <u>Authorization to Request Authority to Issue Tax Credit Bonds</u>. To the extent the Board deems it necessary and advisable to issue all or a portion of the Bonds as Tax Credit Bonds, the Board hereby (a) authorizes the District to request authorization from Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction ("OSPI"), if applicable, to issue such Bonds as Tax Credit Bonds for the purpose of paying costs of the Projects, and (b) designates the Secretary and/or the Business Manager as the District officials authorized to prepare, sign and submit to OSPI the appropriate applications (or other required forms or documents) to issue the Tax Credit Bonds.

Section 14. General Authorization and Ratification. The Secretary, the Business Manager, the President of the Board, other appropriate officers of the District and bond counsel, Foster Pepper PLLC, are severally authorized and directed to take such actions and to execute such documents as in their judgment may be necessary or desirable to effectuate the provisions of this resolution. All actions taken prior to the effective date of this resolution in furtherance of and not inconsistent with the provisions of this resolution are hereby ratified and confirmed in all respects.

<u>Section 15</u>. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this resolution shall be declared by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, then such provision shall be null and void and shall be separable from the remaining provisions of this resolution and shall in no way affect the validity of the other provisions of this resolution, of the Bonds or of the levy or collection of the taxes pledged to pay and retire the Bonds.

RESOLUTION NO. 08-16

A RESOLUTION of the Board of Directors of Prosser Consolidated School District No. 116-219, Benton and Klickitat Counties, Washington, expressing its support for the District's February 14, 2017 ballot proposition (Proposition 1 - Bonds to Construct and Renovate School Facilities), and providing for other matters properly relating thereto, all as more particularly set forth herein.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF PROSSER CONSOLIDATED SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 116-219, BENTON AND KLICKITAT COUNTIES, WASHINGTON, as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Board of Directors (the "Board") of Prosser Consolidated School District No. 116-219, Benton and Klickitat Counties, Washington (the "District"), takes note of the following facts and hereby makes the following findings and determinations:

(a) On November 8, 2016, the Board adopted Resolution No. 07-16, which submits to the District's voters, at the February 14, 2017 special election a ballot proposition authorizing the District to: (1) issue \$69,300,000 of general obligation bonds to pay costs of constructing a new high school on a site owned by the District adjacent to Art Fiker Stadium to replace Prosser High School, renovating and expanding Keene-Riverview, Prosser Heights and Whitstran Elementary Schools, and converting the existing Prosser High School into administrative space; and (2) levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds (the "Bond Ballot Proposition").

(c) Resolution No. 07-16 found and determined that the Bond Ballot Proposition is necessary because of overcrowding (including enrollment demands and State of Washington class size reduction initiatives), educationally outdated infrastructure and classrooms, student safety, the institution of new educational programs, and the need to provide space for administrative services. Accordingly, the Board desires to express its support of the Bond Ballot Proposition at an open public meeting on November 8, 2016 (the "Open Public Meeting") pursuant to RCW 42.17A.555.

(d) Any required notice of the Open Public Meeting, included the title (Bonds to Construct and Renovate School Facilities) and number of the Bond Ballot Proposition (Proposition 1), and members of the Board and members of the public were given equal opportunity to express an opposing view at the Open Public Meeting, and all who wished to speak were heard.

Section 2. Pursuant to RCW 42.17A.555, the Board, after due consideration, and being fully informed and advised, hereby expresses its support for the Bond Ballot Proposition.
