



2018-2019 Dress Code

Students shall be dressed and groomed in a manner that is clean and neat and that shall not be disruptive or a safety hazard to themselves or others. eStem schools prohibit any clothing or grooming that, in the administrator's judgment, may reasonably be expected to cause disruption of normal operations.

School administration maintains final authority on all matters relating to the dress code.

SPECIFIC GUIDELINES

SHIRTS AND BLOUSES

- All shirts and blouses must have sleeves.
- Clothing with low-cut necklines, clothing that exposes the midriff when arms are raised are not permitted.
- Clothing that fully exposes the shoulders & neckline are not permitted.
- Neither camisoles, spaghetti strapped blouses, tank tops or halter tops are permitted.
- Clothing with offensive or suggestive slogans or advertisements is not permitted.

PANTS, SHORTS, AND SKIRTS

- Jeans with holes and torn or patched clothing of any kind is not permitted if the student's skin is visible through the open area.
- Leggings and yoga pants are NOT permitted.
- Baggy clothing and clothes that sag or fall below the waistline are NOT permitted
- Shorts, skirts, and dresses must be to the fingertips or longer
- Pajama bottoms are not permitted

MISCELLANEOUS

- Sandals and open toe shoes are permitted.
- Flip flops are NOT permitted.
- Crocs, slippers/house shoes, shoes that resemble house shoes or shoes with wheels are not permitted.
- Neither hats, hair bonnets, du-rags, headgear, sunglasses, nor bandanas of any color may be worn inside the building.
- Tattoos and body art shall not be visible. Hairstyles and hair colors that are disruptive to the learning environment are not allowed.
- Multiple earrings in one ear, piercings other than ears, or any earrings or jewelry that is inappropriate or may cause safety concerns are not allowed. Tongue rings and other visible body piercings are not allowed.

DRESS CODE VIOLATIONS

**The dress code will be strictly enforced.
The Director of School has final
authority on all matters relating to the
dress code.**

Students violating the dress code will be asked to phone home for appropriate clothing. If appropriate clothing cannot be provided in a timely manner, the student will be issued attire from the main office.

Items borrowed from the school must be returned to the school nurse at the conclusion of the school day or student can be charged a replacement fee.

Violations of the dress code may result in detention(s), loss of privileges, or suspension.

If a student misses class due to a dress code violation, the student will be responsible for making up any missed work.
