



#### **Reading Tips**

Here are some tips to help your kids when they read.

#### WHEN I READ

#### Before I read:

- Think: What do I already know?
- Predict: What do I think will happen?

#### As I read:

- Ask: Did I understand what I just read?
- Were there any words I didn't understand?
- Was anything confusing?
- Can I retell in my own words what I just read?

#### After I read:

• Summarize

# THINGS I CAN DO TO HELP ME UNDERSTAND WHAT I READ

- 1. Sound out an unknown word.
- 2. Go back and reread the passage.
- 3. Look up the meaning of an unknown word.
- 4. Read ahead and see if it makes sense.
- 5. Ask a question and try to find the answer.
- 6. Slow down as I read.
- 7. Do one or more of these things, or something that I've learned to understand what I read.




#### Writing Class



4th Grade- Students will identify and observe energy transfers within different objects that demonstrate different types of energy transfers.

5<sup>th</sup> Grade-Students will analyze and interpret data to model the movement of Earth in relationship to other objects in space.


