

Things you might not know about December holidays

Poinsettias

The traditional Christmas plant we call a poinsettia was known by the Aztecs as cuetlaxochitl. Its current name came from the first U.S. enovy to Mexico, Joel R. Poinsett, who noticed the plant being used for holiday celebrations and sent a few north to the United States in the 1820s.

Hanukkah

Hanukkah, based on the Jewish calendar, is a wandering holiday. This year, the eight-day celebration begins at sunset Dec. 20. In 2016, it starts on Christmas Eve. In 2013, it's *Thanksgiving* eve, Nov. 27.

Kwanzaa

Kwanzaa, which is observed Dec. 26 through Jan. 1, is a nonreligious holiday that celebrates African-American culture. The weeklong event highlights seven principles, including Nia, which is Swahili for "purpose." That's where actress Nia Long got her name.
