TERMS AND INFORMATION FOR REQUIRED ADMINISTRATIVE COMPENSATION DISCLOSURE PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 1608 (4) AND 1716(4) OF THE EDUCATION LAW AS AMENDED BY CHAPTER 474 OF THE LAWS OF 1996

Definition of Terms

Salary shall mean all known salary compensation to which the employee is entitled for the year in gross including any amount of deferred compensation or tax sheltered annuity funded by the district and any retirement incentive or accumulated leave pay-out before or at separation (personal, sick or vacation whether accrued in prior years or not) to be paid in the year.

Annualized Cost of Benefits shall mean the value of all known district contributions for benefits for the employee including payments for retirement, social security and any type of insurance, health insurance, life insurance or medical reimbursement plan from which the employee or the dependents or beneficiaries of the employee might derive a monetary benefit.

In-kind or Other Forms of Remuneration shall mean the annualized value of any known other benefit, not included under Salary or Employee Benefits above, that is deemed to be taxable income by the U.S. Internal Revenue Service. This would include items such as any arrangement between the employee and employer by which the employee receives a benefit such as the use of an automobile for personal travel, monthly allowance for purchase or lease of an automobile or the provision of a residence without charge or at a rental amount which is less than fair market value.

Other details

If any compensation for the ensuing school year is still subject to negotiation or board action at the time of disclosure, the amount of such compensation that is disclosed should equal the amount or estimated amount of compensation appropriated in the proposed budget. The board of education may wish to note that this amount is subject to negotiation or adjustment as part of the disclosure statement appended to the proposed budget.

Administrators/supervisors are certificated staff serving in an administrative/supervisory capacity more than 50 percent of the time.

To determine those salaries of \$150,000 or more payable to administrative/supervisory staff that must be disclosed, estimated salary expenditures shall include base salary and all other remuneration or stipends.

The board of education must append all administrative compensation disclosures to the statement of estimated expenditures available to the public 14 days before the annual or special meeting date set prior to the budget vote.


