Advanced Placement (AP) courses at eStem Public Charter High School (eHS) are **extremely rigorous** and the **equivalent to a college-level course**.

They are intended for students who have demonstrated both the **highest level of academic achievement** and **commitment to hard work**.

Taking an AP course and exam is a **collaborative effort** between the **student**, **parent/guardian**, **teacher**, **and school**. Each party plays a role and must make the commitment to meet the expectations noted in this presentation for **success**.



eHS AP Program Overview


- Currently offer 21 AP Courses
- Follow AP Curriculum set by CollegeBoard
 - Courses are modeled on a comparable introductory college course in the subject.
- Each course culminates in a standardized college-level assessment, or AP Exam.
- AP Exams are given in May each year.
 - Must take AP Exam to earn weighted credit
 - 3 or better earns college credit**

eStem High AP Exams Pass Rate (3+)





AP Program Expectations

Yearly Agreement Linked Here - Due August 18, 2023

- The student agrees to **organize his/her time and effort** to successfully complete the AP course in which he/she is enrolled.
- The student will **notify teachers immediately** if he/she falls behind in class readings and/or assignments.
- The student will be expected to complete assignments, readings and projects **outside of class time.**
- The student will **take the AP Exam** on its scheduled date and time as outlined by the CollegeBoard and eHS.

- If the student does not take the AP Exam, they will forfeit their weighted course credit, which may have an impact on their cumulative GPA & class rank.
- The parent/guardian agrees to be familiar with and accept the AP course requirements and policies and to **help his/her child organize study time** in support of class assignments.
- The parent/guardian agrees to purchase required materials. If the parent/guardian is unable to meet these requirements for financial reasons, they will contact the AP Coordinator immediately.
- The school (AP Teacher and AP Coordinator) agrees to provide **rigorous instruction and challenging course content** as described in the AP Course Description.
- The school will provide the student with the AP Exam Terms & Conditions and agrees to administer the **AP Exam in a fair and secure environment** as outlined in the AP Coordinator's Manual.
- The fee for an unused, canceled, or late AP Exam is \$40, and the student/family is responsible for paying this amount in full to eHS if the student unenrolls from an AP course or misses an AP Exam.
