
GTA, veterans enjoy Veterans Day program

Parents are reminded that medications must not be

law, we must have a physician's authorization in order to administer prescription medications to your children at school, and a parent's authorization for over-the-counter medications (including herbal or homeopathic remedies). Parents must bring both the medication and the authorization form into the appropriate office.

Step by Step Online Store Instructions

- 1. After clicking on the link to the store provided, select your pass option by clicking "Shop Now". This will be the option furthest to the left. You will then be directed to a few more options.
- 2. Select which pass you'd like (Age 19+ for chaperones, Ages 7-18 for students).
 - a. **IF YOU ARE RENTING** Select ski or snowboard below where you selected age.
 - b. <u>IF YOU ARE NOT RENTING</u> **Do not** select ski or snowboard and click "Add to Cart" and proceed with the purchase.
 - c. Once you check the boxes you cannot uncheck them, refresh the page if this happens.
- 3. A brown "Checkout" box should appear after clicking "Add to Cart". Click that button and proceed.
- 4. You are now going to log in. It is likely that you will have to create an account as this is new. Follow the steps provided on how to create an account.
- 5. You will then be redirected back to your cart. Click "Select a Group Member". Your name should then come up below.
 - a. If you are adding more than one student/family member, click "Add Group Member" and enter that person's information in the fields.
 - b. You will also likely have to add a photo unless one comes up where your name is. If you have to add a photo, you must do so before continuing with the purchase.
 - c. Once complete, click the brown "Continue" box at the bottom.
 - i. NOTE: If you do not have a blue Crystal Card from last year, you must choose to get a new card and there is a \$2 fee for this. You will not be able to complete the purchase without selecting this option!!!
- 6. After proceeding, you will have to sign both waivers for the season. Click "Sign" next to both of the waivers. A box will open, scroll to the bottom and follow the prompts. Once these waivers are completed, select "Continue"
- 7. You will then be directed to the payment page. Fill out all the required boxes and then proceed to "Continue" at the bottom.
- 8. Verify all information is correct and click "Confirm Order". You have now completed the pass purchase process.



Shanty Creek Locals Student Season Pass Program

Shanty Creek Resorts is pleased to offer the NEW Locals Student Season Pass Program for the 2022-23 winter sports season. This program is offered to grade 4 - 12 students and/or students aged 9 – 17 in Antrim, Charlevoix, Crawford, Emmet, Grand Traverse, Kalkaska and Otsego counties. Students aged 8 & under can purchase regular passes for \$29.

This new program is designed to offer all students a reduced rate All Area season pass as a reward for their hard work and efforts toward education in what has been unique, challenging and changing environments. Only one pass will be issued per student.

IMPORTANT!! -NEW ONLINE PURCHASE PROCEDURE!

New this year – Local Student passes and Add-a-Parent passes can be purchased online using your schools unique Promo Code. Your Schools code, to be used by all students is **TRAVERSE** to purchase, please follow these steps:

- 1. Go to the season pass section of shantycreek.com and click on **Buy Season Pass** > or visit https://www.shantycreek.com/?module=reset and click on the Promotional Code tab.
- 2. Enter Promo Code TRAVERSE
- 3. Your schools Local Student pass and Add-a-Parent pass will be displayed.
- 4. Follow the instructions through the purchase process.
- 5. For Local Student and Add-a-Parent pass purchases that included all requested information and a photo, and that had Release of Liability waivers completed, your pass will be pre-printed for pick up. Passes will be available for pick up in person beginning November 25, 2022 on the lower level of The Lodge at Cedar River, located at 2400 Troon S, Bellaire, MI 49615. Please have proof of enrollment in your school system when you come to pick up your pass.
- 6. Any pass purchasers that are unable to provide proof of enrollment will have their passes canceled and their money refunded.

Pricing:

Locals Student Season Pass \$ 99 Add-a-Parent passes * \$339

Passes are All Area, unrestricted passes and are valid for 22/23 and good for weekdays, weekends, holidays; days or nights; at Schuss Mountain. Passes are picture passes and are not transferable. All applicable rules regarding SCR passes apply. Passes are good for lift access only and no rental, lesson, or tubing options are available to these pass holders.

* Parents of students purchasing Locals Student Season Passes may purchase "Add-a-parent" passes. Passes must be purchased at the time the student pass is issued and are limited to two parent passes per family.

Fine Print

- Remember, you must supply the accurate proof of student enrollment in one of the 63 participating local schools. Having an address in the local area will not count as proof. Please see above.
- Any Locals Student pass holder caught obtaining or using their pass fraudulently will lose their Locals Student pass privileges for the remainder of their secondary education school career.
- All resort rules governing season passes apply. Students receiving season passes need to be 18 OR have a
 parent/guardian sign release of liability forms. The season pass liability form can be completed during the
 purchase process.
- Season pass holders and their guests are expected to conduct themselves in a safe and courteous manner while using their pass privileges at Shanty Creek.
- We are sorry, but no adjustments may be made to previous 22/23 pass purchases due to this program. Please
 retain this information for future season's pass purchases should you believe you qualify for the Locals Student
 Pass program.
