Academy has joined forces with STOPit Solutions to offer an online reporting tool designed to deter and mitigate bullying, cyber abuse and STOP!T other at-risk behaviors and actions

before they escalate. STOPit provides students and parents access to the STOPit mobile app to make anonymous reports designed to alert school administrators to issues of concern. Hello future 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade parents,

We would like to extend an invitation to your son/daughter to join elementary band for the 2023-2024 school year! All students in 5th and 6th grades have the opportunity to join band at GTA. To help your child prepare for this, middle elementary students will attend a special concert presented by the 8th grade band students. At this concert they will be able to see and listen to the different instruments that are available for students to play in our band program.

On May 26<sup>th</sup>, 30<sup>th</sup>, and 31<sup>st</sup> (during school hours) Mr. Floering and Mrs. Diephouse will be providing "fittings" to help you and your child select an instrument that they are interested in playing and that is also well suited for them to be successful. You will receive a letter with which instrument(s) best suit them along with options for purchasing or renting an instrument. Your child may already know what instrument they would like to play, but we recommend having a couple instruments in mind so that they can try a couple and choose the instrument that physically fits them the best. **Please return the attached permission slip to have your child participate in instrument fittings.** 

We recommend families consider renting an instrument from Marshall Music to help ensure that students are able to learn to play with a quality functional instrument. Instrument rental costs range from \$30-\$85 a month, depending on the instrument. More information about Marshall Music's rental program can be found on their website at **www.marshallmusic.com/rentals**. This program is rent-to-own, so each monthly payment is applied to the total cost of purchasing the instrument. If you decide to purchase a used instrument, it is wise to have it inspected by Marshall Music so that any repairs can be made before school starts.

Be aware that instruments that you find in "big box" stores and stores that are not music stores are not acceptable band instruments. In addition, any instrument that is green, blue, purple, red, or any other color other than natural metal or wood colors are frustrating for beginners because they were not designed to last. Also, if you find an instrument on ebay or the internet, please call or email one of us so we can help advise you on brands. Many of the inexpensive models on the internet advertise as real student instruments, however, they do not work for the students.

# Students must have a band instrument and <u>Standard of Excellence Book 1</u> by Monday September 18, 2023 in order to participate in the 2023-2024 elementary band program.

Please consider your options for an instrument and financially plan for it. We have just a few school owned instruments available in cases of financial hardship. However, we encourage families to work with their children and find areas to cut back to make an instrument possible. When a child is willing to work or sacrifice for it, they will usually take the privilege more seriously and you'll see great results!

### Creating safer places to learn work and live

Dear Parent/Guardian,

We are pleased to announce that our school has enrolled with STOPit, by STOPit Solutions

<u>STOPit</u> is an online reporting tool designed to deter and mitigate bullying, cyber abuse, and other inappropriate behaviors, consisting of an app and a back-end incident management system for school administrators.

Our students will have access to the STOPit mobile app, which has two simple but powerful features.

Specifically, the program educates students to:

- · Recognize the signs of at-risk behaviors
- Take every sign and signal seriously
- Report it anonymously through STOPit App/Web or 24/7 Incident Response Center
- Submit photo or video evidence (App/Web Only)
- Alert designated administrators to issues and risks early, before they escalate

**No personal information is needed to use STOPit.** The only way personally identifiable information will be accessible through STOPit is if a requester voluntarily includes it within the content of a request or message.



Both our school and STOPit are committed to protecting the privacy of student data. STOPit is a signatory to the <u>Student Privacy Pledge</u>, spearheaded by the Future of Privacy Forum and the Software & Information Industry Association. You may review STOPit's <u>Privacy Policy</u> for details, including more information on how anonymous reporting works.

Students have the power to help put an end to harmful and inappropriate behavior they see online through social media and other means. They can use STOPit to reach out for help if they or a peer are facing a personal crisis or experiencing bullying, abuse, or are otherwise in need of assistance. Our goal with STOPit is to create safer, kinder, school communities both online and off.

We encourage you to download the STOPit app and search for your students' school using the directory. You can privately ask for help for your student, family, others you care about, or even acquaintances who appear to need help. For a video on how to use STOPit, go to: **Student Training Video**.
