## Important immunization reminder for incoming kindergarteners and 7<sup>th</sup> graders

We are so looking forward to welcoming our incoming kindergarten students and those who will be making the move from elementary to junior high! Certain immunizations are required for entry into school, while the meningococcal conjugate vaccine and a DTaP booster are given at ages 11-12. Please check with your health care provider to be sure that immunizations are up to date. If you have opted against any of the required vaccines, please contact the health department to receive a current, certified State of Michigan waiver form, or your health care provider for a medical contraindication form. We ask that either a

copy of the appropriate form or current immunization record be provided to us by the end of July.
