

Huntington Local ARP ESSER Funds Plan

Huntington Local's ARP ESSER funds be used to implement prevention and mitigation strategies that are, to the greatest extent practicable, consistent with the most recent CDC guidance on reopening schools, in order to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in-person learning. This includes extended cleaning practices using CDC approved products.

How will the LEA use the funds it reserves under section 2001(e)(1) of the ARP Act to address the academic impact of lost instructional time through the implementation of evidence-based interventions, such as summer learning or summer enrichment, extended day, comprehensive afterschool programs, or extended school year. Huntington Local is using these funds to provide more reading instruction in the elementary level, summer extended learning, more intervention specialists.

The LEA ensure that the interventions it implements, including but not limited to the interventions implemented under section 2001(e)(1) of the ARP Act to address the academic impact of lost instructional time, will respond to the academic, social, emotional and mental health needs of all students, and particularly those students disproportionately impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, including students from low-income families, students of color, English learners, children with disabilities, students experiencing homelessness, children in foster care and migratory students. Huntington Local's plan for addressing learning loss will be attempted by administering and using high-quality assessments to assess students' academic progress and meet students' academic needs, including through differentiating instruction; implementing evidence-based activities to meet the comprehensive needs of students; providing information and assistance to parents and families on how they can effectively support students, including in a distance learning environment; and/or tracking student attendance and improving student engagement in distance education.

Huntington Local will use a significant percentage of these funds for developing strategies and implementing public health protocols including, to the greatest extent practicable, policies in line with guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for the reopening and operation of school facilities to effectively maintain the health and safety of students, educators and other staff. Huntington Local will use ARP ESSER Funds to hire new staff or pay the salary of existing staff that will allow us to continue maintaining the operations and continuity of services in the district.

Huntington Local will spend its remaining ARP ESSER funds consistent with section 2001(e)(2) of the ARP Act on projects such as maintaining the outdoor learning centers that have been added, replacing germ filled carpet in classrooms and other projects as the need arises.
