►CTE Update

This week Mrs. Jones and I met with New River Technical and hope to partner with them to offer a third year of Electrical Technician Program to our student and adult students of Summers County. They are currently preparing a proposal. This is an effort to capture monies from the federal government and tuition from adult students. Should this partnership commence, 10th grade students will be allowed to enter the program and graduate not only being certified as a journeyman, but earn edge credits to advance them should they choose to continue at New River Technical or another institution with the same associate degrees. These 3rd students, which are 9th graders this year, would be eligible to enter the INDT (industrial trades program) at NRT. This would be the first time ever that Summers County has had this type of partnership that will not only benefit our students in post-secondary but provide opportunity to sustain the program for many years and allow other adults in Summers County to enter the program. Keep in mind that we are in the preliminary stages and this is a lengthy process. This may not come to fruition but all parties seem extremely hopeful. Should the partnership not happen, and it not customary to allow 10th graders in the CTE programs in Summers County, we could allow 10th graders in a 2 year program if they are successful in an application and interview process.

As per Mr. Duncan, I have included a draft job posting. However, it is too early to begin posting for this position since the application was just submitted by Mrs. Jones on 1/29/2020 and we will not hear back until April 15, 2020! Also, I would be remiss if I did not include an email exchange between Mrs. Crook CSBO and Dr. D'Antoni on 1/8/2020 which have provided you a copy of that in your pink packet. While Mr. Duncan is right, there are no strings attached to the grant, there is, however a financial commitment in order to be awarded the grant in the first place. Please note that has been highlighted in Dr. D'Antonis email with Mrs. Crook.

I would ask the board at this time to consider holding off on directing me to post the job until we have completed all of the preliminary steps to the tedious process, with a legitimate plan and documentation of adequate funding. Bottom line is you can't commit monies you don't have and as of now, the funding isn't there. Ultimately it is my sworn duty to keep this board accurately apprised of all information needed so you can make a sound financial decision in all matters. Please be patient and let my office continue the process as we know it to be. If you need further guidance on this matter, please contact me directly. Come on in and sit down, we will talk as long as we need to so that we are all on the same page.
